Charleston Southern makes its first road trip of the season this weekend as the Buccaneers make the trek to Knoxville, Tenn. and Sherri Parker Lee Stadium as CSU takes on South Alabama, Tennessee, and Toledo at the Tennessee Invitational on March 2-4.

The Bucs take on the Jaguars, Volunteers, and the Rockets over the weekend as CSU looks to continue its early season success. The Bucs posted winning records over each of the first three weekends, including going a perfect 6-0 this past weekend at the Willie Jewell's Invitational.

The Bucs boast a Winkler-era high eight-game winning streak heading into the weekend. Each of the four teams will face each other in a round-robin tournament style format over the first six games of the weekend before taking part in seeded games the rest of the way. Championship game for the weekend is set for 12:30 p.m. on Sunday afternoon, while the consolation game on Sunday morning is set for 9:30 a.m.

The matchup between the Jaguars and the Bucs to open the weekend will be just the third time the teams have faced off against each other in program history. The Bucs' afternoon matchup against the Volunteers also serves as UT's 2018 home opener and is CSU's first appearance in Knoxville since the 2014 NCAA Regional matchup between the two squads. The Bucs and Toledo feature a number of familiar faces across the dugouts and played each other four times in Hawaii in the 2017 season.

Live stats for all games this weekend can be accessed on the CSU Softball schedule page. The Bucs' game against the Volunteers will be streamed live via the SEC Network Plus.

FACING SOUTH ALABAMA

Charleston Southern faces a battle-tested opponent in the Buccaneers' opener against South Alabama on Friday morning as the Buccaneers take on the Jaguars at 10 a.m. The Jags have already taken on at least seven teams in their preseason tournament slate that are either receiving votes or are ranked in the two NCAA polls, including picking up a 3-1 win over 9/7 Florida State on February 21 in Mobile, Ala.

The Jaguars were picked fourth overall in the preseason Sun Belt poll after a 2017 season that saw South Alabama boast a 35-20 overall record and 15-12 mark in conference play. Three USA players were selected to the preseason All-Sun Belt team including senior pitcher Devin Brown and senior middle infielders Kaleigh Todd and Kristian Foster.

Through the early part of the season Brown has once again reprised her role as the ace of the staff. The senior right-hander has made a teamhigh 12 appearances and five complete games to go with a 6-4 record and 2.33 ERA. Alexis Reid has also made multiple appearances in the circle, including a team-high eight starts to go with a 3.47 ERA in 44.1 innings' pitched.

Brittani Reid boasts the team's highest batting average on the year with a .314 average through 16 games played. Abby Krzywiecki boasts the power with a team-high two home runs, while Kristin Foster has a team-high 12 hits, including three doubles.

Charleston Southern has faced the Jaguars twice in head coach Shane Winkler's tenure. The Bucs took on USA in the 2010 season, falling at the Georgia Tournament, 8-3. CSU also fell to the Jaguars in the 2015 season at South Carolina's tournament, 3-2. None of the current CSU roster has faced USA.

FACING TENNESSEE

Tennessee is the highest-ranked team the Buccaneers are scheduled to face in the 2018 regular season as CSU takes on the host Volunteers on Friday afternoon at 3 p.m. The Bucs' last visit to Knoxville came in the 2014 NCAA Regional with CSU falling 12-3 to the Volunteers in their first postseason game in program history. CSU will be UT's opener on the weekend as the No. 5/5 Volunteers welcome Toledo, CSU, and South Alabama to Sherri Parker Lee Stadium. UT boasts a 16-1 overall record on the season with the lone loss coming to Florida Atlantic at the Michele Smith Tournament in Clearwater, Fla., a 3-2 setback against the Owls.

Tennessee was picked second overall in the SEC Preseason Coaches' poll with the Volunteers receiving 119 votes and one first place vote after advancing to the NCAA Knoxville Super Regional in 2017. Senior infielder Meghan Gregg was the lone Volunteer on the SEC Preseason All-Conference team.

Gregg has been the difference-maker at the plate early for UT with the senior batting .500 with a team-high 27 hits, six doubles, five home runs, and 24 RBI. Scarlet McSwain has added pop with four home runs, while Aubrey Leach is a difference-maker on the base paths with 23 runs scored to go with a team-high four stolen bases. Matty Motts and Caylan Arnold lead UT's pitching efforts on the year with the duo combining to record 27 appearances and 14 starts in the season. Motts boasts an 8-1 record and a 1.14 ERA, while Arnold comes into the weekend with a 1.43 ERA and a perfect 6-0 mark in the circle.

The Bucs are 0-4 all-time against the Volunteers with the first matchup coming in the 2005 season at the Georgia Southern Tournament. UT has played two games at CSU with both coming in the 2013 season.

FACING TOLEDO

Familiar faces and an opponent the Buccaneers have faced in two of the last three seasons will take the opposite dugout when the Bucs close out the last of the three scheduled games against the Rockets on Saturday morning at 10 a.m. Head Coach Kristen Butler and Assistant Coach Brandon Duncon both served as CSU pitching coaches on Shane Winkler's staff. Volunteer assistant coach Natalie Yonan lined up for the Bucs over the 2013-16 seasons.

Toledo boasts a 7-3 overall record heading into the Tennessee Invitational with winning marks at both the Dot Richardson's NCSI and the WKU Hilltopper Classic. The Rockets were picked fifth in the West Division in the MAC preseason softball poll after posting a 24-34 overall record in 2017. Freshman catcher Bailey Curry leads the Rockets' offense early in the year with a team-high .375 batting average to go with 12 hits and a pair of home runs. Freshman shortstop Kylie Norwood is also hitting above .300 over the first 10 games of the year with a .355 mark to go with a team-high five runs scored.

Junior Kailey Minarchick returns to the circle and leads the Rockets' pitching efforts with a teamhigh eight appearances. She boasts a 4-1 record and a 1.09 ERA while posting a 15:4 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Heather Webb has made a team-high four starts to go with a 3-1 record and a 0.88 ERA. The Bucs fell four times to the Rockets last season in Honolulu, Hawaii as the two teams were out west for the Coca-Cola Malihini Kipa Aloha Tournament (March 3-5, 2017), and the Outrigger Resorts Spring Fling (March 8-11).

>Jade Gandara continues to swing a hot bat in the CSU lineup as the junior slugger paces the Bucs in batting average (.478), hits (22), runs (16), home runs (6) and RBI (22). She is also one of the toughest players in the nation to strikeout recording only one in her 46 at-bats.

>Mallory Kasinger and Caitlyn Emberson lead the Bucs with six doubles apiece on the season. Kasinger is second on the team in hits (17) and RBI (15), while Emberson is tied with Gandara for the team lead with 16 runs scored.

>Five newcomers and eight players overall have hit home runs in the 2018 season as Annie Bakenhus joined the group this past weekend. Freshmen Nina Del Rio (4) and Sarah Brown 93) have provided pop in the middle of the lineup for Coach Winkler.

>Meghan Gagliano leads a speedy CSU lineup with a team-high 10 stolen bases in 12 attempts on the year. Four different CSU players have recorded multiple steals on the season with Annie Bakenhus (5), Kendall Anderson (3), and Sarah Brown (3) all showing their athleticism on the base paths.

>Holly Clark leads a deep CSU pitching staff with a team-high three shutouts in her seven starts in 2018.

>Three different CSU pitchers have accounted for all of CSU's wins-losses in the 2018 season with Clark (4-1), Alyssa Heinrich (4-1), and Arizona Pilgrim (4-1) all boasting matching records in the circle.

RECAPPING CSU'S EARLY SCHEDULE

Thanks to a favorable tournament slate that saw CSU host its first 16 games in the friendly confines of the CSU Softball Field, the Buccaneers enter the weekend with a 13-3 record following Wednesday's win over St. Bonaventure. CSU opened the year with a trio of the wins at the opening Wingate by Wyndham Invitational, and then followed with three more wins the ensuing weekend at the Buccaneer Invitational.

Shane Winkler enters his 10th season as the head softball coach at Charleston Southern in 2017-18 with 235 career victories with the Buccaneers going into the season.

The Buccaneers posted a 26-36 record in the 2017 season as CSU advanced to the postseason again in the new conference tournament format. The Bucs topped Winthrop in the opening game before falling in back-to-back contests to Liberty and Winthrop. Known for their ability to connect on the longball, the Bucs connected on 65 home runs in the 2017 season paced by Jade Gandara's 16 home runs, while Caitlyn Emberson (11) was also in double-digits.

In the 2015-16 season, Winkler guided the Bucs to a seventh-place finish in the Big South. In 2015, the Buccaneers had their third 30-win season under his tutelage as CSU posted a 31-28 record, including a program-record 22 wins at home. The Buccaneers had six Big South Player/Pitcher of the Week honorees this season and had four players recognized on the postseason Big South All-Conference team with Amanda Matsumoto, Cheyenne Gandara, Marci Christian and Stephanie Baro all earning honors. The Buccaneers finished 43rd in the NCAA in home runs per game and had 10 individual players recognized among the top 100 in the NCAA in multiple categories on the season. CSU won multiple games in the Big South Tournament for the fifth straight season under Winkler.

In the 2014 season at Charleston Southern, Winkler guided the Buccaneers to the best season in program history with their first postseason berth in the NCAA tournament. Winker's guidance was key during the stretch run with the Bucs as the head coach deftly mixed a roster filled with an influx of freshmen talent and senior leadership into a conference title run. The Buccaneers went a perfect 4-0 in the 2014 Big South Championships and topped Coastal Carolina 3-1 in the Championship Game to advance to the Knoxville Regional of the 2014 NCAA Tournament. Cheyenne Gandara was named the 2014 Big South Tournament MVP, while Stephanie Sbardella, Stephanie Bergmann and Amanda Matsumoto were all named to the All-Tournament team.

The 2013 season saw the Buccaneers again made an impact in the Big South Championships as CSU staved off elimination against Presbyterian behind a standout 11 strikeout performance by Jennifer Giles and the Bucs also handed top-seed Coastal Carolina their first loss in a 2-0 shutout. CSU had three players named to the Big South All-Conference team, including First Team Utility Player Marci Christian, as well as Second Team selections Stephanie Sbardella and Jana Matthews. Matthews wrapped up a standout four year career with the Bucs, graduating as CSU's all-time leader in home runs, RBI and total bases, while Christian shattered the CSU single season home run record with 15 in her first season at Charleston Southern.

Under the guidance of Winkler, CSU established program-bests in 2012 with 12 Big South wins and 33 overall victories, and came within one win of its first-ever NCAA Tournament bid with a berth in the Big South Tournament Championship Game for the first time since 1988. Along the way, the Bucs defeated the likes of South Carolina and Notre Dame in out-of-conference play and compiled a six-game winning streak which is the longest during Winkler's tenure. Morgan Dowdy set a single-season CSU record with 165 strikeouts and earned a spot on the Big South's All-Conference Second Team, as did left fielder Jana Matthews, who smacked six more home runs and led the club with 33 RBI. Megan Lombard also put the finishing touches on a brilliant four-year run under Winkler's tutelage, as the senior shortstop smoked seven homers and wrapped up her career as CSU's all-time leader in home runs, RBI, hits, slugging percentage and total bases.

Even before a banner year in 2012, Winkler was instrumental in restoring a winning tradition to the Buccaneer softball program. In 2010, CSU posted its first 30-win season since 1993, setting numerous program records along the way, and the 2011 club tied the program record with 10 Conference victories.

Under the direction of Winkler, CSU has had 15 players earn a total of 18 Big South All-Conference Team honors. Additionally, in 2010, senior Caitlin Allen became the first CSU player to be named Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year. In the past four seasons, CSU has garnered four conference player of the week awards and eight pitcher of the week laurels.

Coach Winkler's teams have set or tied numerous CSU records since 2009. A total of 15 individual single-season records and 10 career standards have been set during Winkler's time at Charleston Southern. The Bucs have broken 11 single-season team records in the past five seasons as well.

The Winkler <u>File</u>

- Shane Winkler begins his 10th season as the head coach at Charleston Southern.
- Winkler played at Butler after also playing at Purdue and Illinois Central College.
- He graduated from Butler in 2004 with a degree in communication studies.
- Winkler is second in the Big South Conference in active wins (248), and is third overall in conference wins (83).
- His CSU team in 2014 is the only team besides Longwood to win the conference tournament dating back to the 2013 season.

Hired before the 2008-09 school year, Winkler came to Charleston Southern after three seasons as the assistant coach at Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia.

While at Marshall, Winkler worked mainly with the offense and outfield while assisting with the overall team defense, recruiting, and all administrative duties within the program. During his three seasons the Thundering Herd had a combined record of 91-78. During his time with the Marshall offense, the team broke its homerun record twice, including a combined 52 homeruns in 2008 with an overall team batting average of .288. Winkler had the opportunity to coach four players that continued their softball careers in the NPF.

Prior to Marshall, Winkler spent one season as the Co-Head Coach at Danville Area Community College in Danville, Illinois. He inherited a team at DACC that had won 11 games in 2004 and led the program to its first winning season in 12 years by posting a 28-25 record in 2005.

Thanks to the perfect 6-0 mark at the Willie Jewell's Invitational, the Bucs boast a Winkler-era best eight-game winning streak heading into the Tennessee Invitational, their first true road test of the season.

The Bucs' Jade Gandara captured a pair of conference Player of the Week nods over the first three weeks of the season, while sophomore ace Holly Clark is the reigning Big South Pitcher of the Week thanks to her efforts this past weekend. The Bucs combined to hit 22 home runs over the first 15 games of the year, sitting tied for fifth overall in the NCAA in total home runs over the first three weekends.

TOUGH TOURNAMENT SLATE

Similar to most schools around the country, Charleston Southern takes on a challenging preseason slate as the Buccaneers will compete in five separate tournaments prior to opening Big South Conference play on March 16. Along with CSU's three home tournaments, the Bucs will also compete at the Tennessee Invitational hosted by Tennessee and the Holy City Showdown hosted by College of Charleston. Tennessee is the highest-ranked opponent on the schedule heading into the season as the Volunteers were selected 11/12 overall in the two major polls. The Volunteers are coming off another trip to the NCAA Super Regional before falling to Texas A&M.

NCAA TOP 25 TEAM CATEGORIES

Thanks to the power surge this past weekend that featured 12 home runs and more than 20 extra base hits, Charleston Southern moved into the top 10 in home runs per game and slugging percentage on the season. The Bucs entered the week tied for fifth overall in total home runs (22) and are fifth in team home runs per game at 1.47. CSU is also fifth in slugging percentage at .595 on the season.

Eight different players in the CSU lineup are hitting above .300 on the year to help the Bucs move to 17th in the country with a team batting average of .337. The Bucs' offensive binge also put CSU 15th in the country in scoring with 6.93 runs per game. CSU is also 25th in the country in on-base percentage at .410. CSU also made moves in the stolen base game as the Bucs are 36th in the country with 1.80 steals per game.

PUTTING UP RUNS IN A HURRY

Charleston Southern's offense has been the nation's best in putting up runs in the early portion of the 2018 season as the Buccaneers entered the week pacing the Big South with 6.93 runs per game. The Bucs' mark is also 15th in the country in runs scoring per game. CSU has put up less than four runs just twice in the 2018 season and has eclipsed eight runs on seven separate occasions, including 15 in CSU's five-inning victory over Towson on February 10, and 12 runs on February 23 against George Mason. The Bucs have run-ruled opponents on five separate occasions this season and currently are one of two conference teams to be hitting above .300 at .337.

OPPONENTS CAN'T SCORE

Not only has Charleston Southern been effective offensively in the 2018 season, the Buccaneers have been nearly as effective in keeping opponents off the scoreboard. CSU has posted five shutouts over the first 16 games of the season and have held opponents under four runs in 10 different games on the year. The Bucs lead the conference with a Big South-best 1.89 ERA on the season paced by Holly Clark's 1.33 mark for the year. Arizona Pilgrim (1.99) and Alyssa Heinrich (1.99) are also in the top 10 in the conference in the individual category on the year, while Clark and Pilgrim are also in the top six in the Big South in opponent batting average.

BIG SOUTH PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jade Gandara earned the recognition for the second time this season after leading Charleston Southern to a perfect 6-0 record this past weekend at the Willie Jewell's Invitational at the CSU Softball Field. Gandara led CSU's offense with eight hits, seven runs scored and six extra base hits, including a trio of home runs. She also added 10 RBI and a stolen base to help extend the Bucs win streak to seven.

Gandara opened the weekend with a double and a pair of RBI in CSU's 9-0 win over St. Bonaventure. She followed with a triple and home run to go with three runs scored and four RBI in a win over George Mason. She added another home run in CSU's 7-1 win over George Mason, then another dinger with two runs scored and a pair of RBI in a win over Hartford.

BIG SOUTH PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Along with Gandara earning Player of the Week honors, sophomore right-hander Holly Clark earned conference Pitcher of the Week recognition this past weekend. Clark recorded her team-leading third shutout of the season in the opener last weekend against St. Bonaventure, and then added a win in the Bucs' final game against Hartford to record a 2-0 weekend record. She made four appearances overall, which included three starts and a shutout.

Clark struck out four in the complete blanking against St. Bonaventure, then went on to record a scoreless relief appearance against George Mason. She followed that up with her third walkless appearance where she picked up her fourth win of the season in a win against the Hawks.

FRESHMAN POWER

Key to Charleston Southern's success early in the season has been the power surge from the bats of freshmen Nina Del Rio, Sarah Brown, Taylor Gleason, and Madison Koger. The CSU quartet has combined for 11 home runs over the first 16 games with Del Rio and Brown connecting on four apiece. Lining up primarily in the cleanup and the fifth position, Brown and Del Rio have combined for eight home runs, four doubles, a triple, and 25 RBI in the heart of the CSU lineup. Gleason added home runs in back-to-back games at the Buccaneer Invitational, while Koger also homered in the Buccaneer Invitational. Along with newcomer Annie Bakenhus (1 home run). CSU has 12 of their 25 home runs accounted for by players not on the 2017 roster.

BACK-TO-BACK (AND REPEAT)

Following Mallory Kasinger and Sarah Brown's back-to-back home runs on Wednesday afternoon against St. Bonaventure, the Buccaneers have connected on back-to-back home runs in four separate games in the 2018 season. Madison Koger and Taylor Gleason were the first to accomplish the feat on February 16 against Valparaiso. Sarah Brown and Nina Del Rio were the second duo with back-to-back shots on February 24 against George Mason. Caitlyn Emberson and Jade Gandara followed later that day with back-to-back shots against Hartford.

CHASING CSU RECORDS

Jade Gandara continues her ascent in the CSU Career Record books as the junior outfielder moves up the CSU rankings in multiple categories. The Hemet, Calif. native enters the weekend 19th all-time in career hits (130), third in home runs (29), 11th in doubles (28), 14th in runs (75), and sixth in RBI (103). She will attempt to continue to move up in the rankings in her third season with the Bucs.

STEALING IN BUNCHES

Meghan Gagliano has certainly made a name for herself on the basepaths to start the 2018 season as the fleet-footed freshman leads the Big South Conference with 11 stolen bases over the first 16 games of the season. Gagliano has posted multiple stolen bases in two separate games this season and has steals in seven of her last eight heading into the weekend. The freshman leads a resurgent CSU running game that boasts 29 steals in 32 attempts and has four players with at least three steals on the year. Overall, 10 different CSU players have recorded stolen bases in the 2018 season with Annie Bakenhus (5-for-5), Kendall Anderson (4-for-4), and Sarah Brown (3-for-3) all boasting perfect marks on the year.

BIG SOUTH LEADERS

The Bucs' success over the past three weeks have translated into multiple top appearances in the Big South standings. As a team, CSU entered the week pacing the Big South in batting average (.337), runs (104), home runs (22), RBI (97), ERA (2.01), wins (12), and shutouts (5). Kasinger and Emberson led the Big South in doubles (6), while Emberson paced the conference in walks (10). Gagliano was the conference leader in steals (10).

NEWCOMERS ABOUND

Charleston Southern welcomes 10 newcomers to the 2018 roster this season, including a pair of transfers in Emily Visnic and Annie Bakenhus. Altogether, it marks one of the largest classes of newcomers for the Bucs in recent history. CSU's largest signing class to date remains the 2014 class that led the Bucs to their first NCAA Tournament following their Big South Championship run.

HOME BIG SOUTH SLATE

Charleston Southern will host four Big South Conference opponents at the CSU Softball Field in the 2018 season. The Bucs will welcome reigning conference champion Longwood (March 24-25), Presbyterian (March 30-31), Campbell (April 14-15), and Radford (May 4-5).

CSU took two of the three games against Longwood in the 2016 season as the Bucs swept the doubleheader on the final day of the series. The remaining three opponents took the series against CSU, 2-1. Radford swept the first day to win the series over the Bucs. Campbell took the first and third games to take the series against the Bucs. Presbyterian took both games of the doubleheader to win the series over CSU.

ROAD BIG SOUTH SLATE

The Buccaneers open the conference slate on March 16-17 on the road in Rock Hill, S.C. against Winthrop. CSU will follow up with road trips to Gardner-Webb (April 7-8) and Liberty (April 20-21). The Bucs took the road series against the Runnin' Bulldogs and the Eagles in their last trips in the 2016 season. The Flames took two of three against the Bucs for CSU's lone road conference series loss against remaining opponents.

CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

The 2018 Big South Conference softball tournament will be held at the Radford Softball Stadium on the campus of Radford University. The top six teams in the regular standings will make the double-elimination tournament. Longwood is the reigning champion with the Lancers winning the title each of the last three seasons.

PILGRIM/CLARK PROVIDING VETERAN PRESENCE IN THE CIRCLE

Junior Arizona Pilgrim and sophomore Holly Clark return to reprise a veteran presence for a young pitching staff in the circle in the 2018 season. The duo combined for 74 appearances and 36 starts over CSU's 62 games, as well as throwing 254.0 of the Bucs' 406.0 innings pitched last season. Pilgrim led the Bucs' pitching staff with nine wins in 2018, including her first collegiate no-hitter on March 21, 2017, in CSU's 7-0 win over South Carolina State. Clark, a 2017 Big South All-Freshman selection, led the team with 40 appearances and 85 strikeouts, adding nine complete games and a pair of shutouts. The duo will be in full force this season to help guide a pitching staff that includes three true freshmen in Heinrich, Del Rio, and Visnic.

EMBERSON'S POWER STROKE AMONG THE BIG SOUTH'S BEST

Junior catcher Caitlyn Emberson brings her big bat back to the middle of the CSU lineup in the 2018 season after finishing fourth in the Big South and second on the Bucs with 11 home runs. The Taft, Calif. native has connected on 20 home runs over her two seasons at CSU, good enough to sit tied for sixth all-time in Buccaneer history in the category. Her hitting prowess, as well as her bat control, put her third in the Big South in onbase percentage (.444). Emberson also took one for the team on more than one occasion last year in leading the nation after being hit by 28 pitches.

A two-time All-Conference selection, Emberson boasts a .297 career batting average at the plate.

NEWCOMERS LOOKING TO MAKE AN IMPACT

The talented trio of newcomers will be making their debut in the circle for the Bucs this season as Alyssa Heinrich, Nina Del Rio, and Emily Visnic will all see time on the rubber for CSU. Heinrich, a Wando graduate, was a two-time Lower State Finalist and earned All-Lowcountry Co-Player of the Year honors in her senior season. Del Rio showcased her all-around skills at Brea Olinda High School and the Firecrackers Lutterloh club team, earning Pitcher, MVP, and Offensive Player of the Year honors multiple times throughout her career. Visnic, a Millers Creek, N.C. native, was a member of the 1A State Championship team at West Wilkes High School. She was also a standout on the track team, finishing among the tops in the state in shot put.

KASINGER'S VETERAN PRESENCE PLAYS A KEY ROLE

Seeing more time at catcher this season, Mallory Kasinger returns for her sophomore season in the CSU lineup. Kasinger's bat made an immediate impact in the lineup as the Riverside, Calif. native opened the year with a bang, connecting on home runs in each of her first three games of the season. She earned All-Freshman honors and finished seventh in the conference with eight home runs on the year while adding five doubles. She showed off her prowess on the infield as well as leading the Bucs with 89 assists. Joining Jade Gandara and Caitlyn Emberson, Kasinger returns as one of three players who lined up in at least 59 games in the 2017 season.

NEW FACES AROUND THE FIELD

The 2018 CSU infield will feature a variety of new faces all around. Gone are stalwarts Stephanie Bergmann, Stevi Johnson, Brittany McPherson, and Lexie Vanada. The Bucs do return a veteran presence in sophomores Summer Moore and Mallory Kasinger, junior Destini Ewing, and senior Laina Holmgren. The new faces will play prominently in the CSU lineup with Sarah Brown, Madison Koger (see below), and Taylor Gleason all expected to see time in the infield in 2018. Brown was a standout member of the three-time defending CIF Sac-Joaquin Championship team and earned All-League honors multiple seasons in high school. Gleason brings speed to the lineup after running cross country and track at May River High School, to go with earning All-State recognition in her junior and senior season on the softball team.

SLUGGING HER WAY UP THE RECORD BOOKS

Similar to fellow junior Caitlyn Emberson, Jade Gandara brings a big bat to the Charleston Southern lineup in the 2018 season. The Hemet, Calif. native finished the 2017 season second in the conference with 16 home runs and was the 2018 Preseason Big South Player of the Year runner-up after a standout season. Swinging from the left side of the batters box, Gandara led the Bucs in multiple categories on the season including home runs, slugging percentage, RBI, total bases, and batting average. She is currently

tied for fourth all-time in the CSU career home run rankings (23) and is 10th overall in career RBI (81) heading into her third season with the Bucs.

REPLACING MATSUMOTO

Annie Bakenhus will be given the first opportunity to replace all-time great Amanda Matsumoto in centerfield this season. The junior from Bethune-Cookman earned First Team All-Conference honors in her freshman season and combined speed. power, and athleticism to the outfield that will look to replace the production of Matsumoto. One of three left-handed bats on the CSU roster in the 2018 season, Bakenhus' ability to flash the glove, as well as handle herself at the plate will be a key to the Bucs' offensive and defensive successes in 2018.

SPEED WINS

Replacing Matsumoto's presence in the lineup also includes the speed element in CSU's defensive lineup. The Bucs return only nine stolen bases out of the 62 accumulated by the team last season led by Jade Gandara's three steals. Christi Takac added a pair of steals, while Caitlyn Emberson, Destini Ewing, Sydney Garling, and Mallory Kasinger all recorded steals on the season. The Bucs will look to be active on the base paths this season with Taylor Gleason and Bakenhus helping make strides, while an overall emphasis in athleticism and speed across the roster will be felt around the lineup in 2018.

KOGER READY FOR THE SHORTSTOP ROLE

For the first time since the 2014 championship run, CSU will have a new shortstop manning the middle of the infield this season as freshman Madison Koger looks ready to take on the role vacated by alum Stephanie Bergmann. Bergmann finished her CSU career sixth all-time with 333 assists while taking a vital role in the CSU defensive scheme. Koger will look to continue the trend of the Bucs' strong infield play up the middle this season as a true freshman. A Fairfield, Ohio native, Koger was a three-time All-Conference and All-League selection, earning Offensive Player of the Year honors over her final three seasons at Fairfield High School and the Ohio Hawks club team. She will be put to the test early taking over a leadership role that returns only three regulars to the lineup in 2018.

EWING'S VERSATILITY GIVEN AN OPPORTUNITY TO SHINE

Destini Ewing's ability to line up in multiple positions across the infield will be a key aspect to the early portion of the 2018 season for the Bucs. The Columbus, Ohio native has earned 30 starts and lined up in 52 games over her first two seasons with the Bucs, seeing time at both second base and shortstop for CSU during the span. A two-time All-OCC selection in high school, her bat came to life early last season with her first collegiate home runs coming against S.C. State. Ewing's ability to play multiple positions will be key early in the year as the Buccaneers continue to look for a consistent lineup in the infield.
