

### **2014 SEASON PREVIEW**

After finishing as the 2013 national runner-up, No. 1 Tennessee begins its 2014 quest for a seventh Women's College World Series trip and another chance to shine the brightest on softball's grandest stage. The Lady Vols open the 2014 season on Friday, Feb. 7, at 3 p.m. ET against Northern Colorado at the Eagle Round Robin in Statesboro. Ga.

For the first time in program history, Tennessee will start the season at No. 1 in both the USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 Preseason Poll and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll. UT enjoyed one of its finest seasons in program history in 2013, finishing as the national runner-up, making its sixth Women's College World Series appearance in nine years and posting its eighth 50-win season with a final record of 52-12. Several Lady Vols garnered prestigious conference and national honors during the team's record-breaking run to Oklahoma City.

In 2014, Tennessee returns 11 talented veterans from its Championship Series squad, including All-American seniors **Ellen Renfroe** (2011, 2012) and **Madison Shipman** (2012, 2013). Both Renfroe and Shipman were named to the "Watch List" for the 2014 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award and the Preseason All-SEC Team. The team also welcomes seven exciting newcomers who will help bolster a roster built for a postseason run. SEC coaches picked Tennessee to finish second in the conference in the league's annual preseason poll.

UT returns five positional starters and three pitchers from last year's staff, including a 2013 ace in Renfroe. The 2014 team's talent and depth across the board point to another successful campaign and several new faces are expected make an immediate impact at the plate, in the batter's box and in the circle.

Here is a position-by-position breakdown of the 2014 Tennessee softball team:

#### INFIELD/CATCHERS

Tennessee's infield will have a different look as UT fans had probably grown accustomed to seeing **Raven** Chavanne at third and **Lauren Gibson** at second over the last three years (Chavanne was an outfielder in 2010).

This season marks a new era for the Tennessee infield as freshman **Taylor Koenig** is slated to open the year at third base and freshman **Megan Geer** will start at second base. Both freshmen enjoyed standout fall seasons with Geer leading the team with a .520 fall batting average (13-for-25) with five homers and 13 RBIs and Koenig hitting

.364 with one homer and five runs driven in. Chemistry for throws from third to second should be no problem as Geer and Koenig have been teammates for years. Prior to joining Tennessee, the duo won numerous PGF National Championships for So Cal Athletics, including the 2013 18U Premier Division crown this past summer.

Junior transfer **Alley Perkins**, who was a 2013 NFCA CaIJC All-American South Team selection for Santa Ana College, can play multiple positions and will serve as the primary backup for both third base and shortstop. Sophomore **Anna Renfroe** has made strides in her second season at UT and will be the backup at second base.

Shipman, who was an NFCA First-Team All-American, First-Team All-SEC pick and SEC All-Defensive Team selection, returns as one of the best all-around shortstops in the nation. Her steady glove and strong arm make hits through the left side nearly impossible for opposing hitters and her 19 career double-plays rank fifth all-time in UT history. Shipman is also the team's most-decorated returning batter and she is coming off a banner junior season, setting or tying several career highs with a .367 batting average, 11 homers, 20 doubles, 77 hits, 52 runs, a .429 on-base percentage and a .619 slugging percentage.

Cheyanne Tarango returns as Tennessee's starter at first base and, like Shipman, she is coming off a career year. The junior from Anaheim Hills, Calif., improved in every statistical category in 2013, ranking third on the team with 10 homers and 51 RBIs. Tarango will also see many innings in the circle once again as she went 6-1 with a 1.44 ERA last season and enjoyed a signature moment in the Knoxville Super Regional when she shut down Alabama with two runners on and no outs in an impressive fifth inning in relief that helped UT secure a trip to the Women's College World Series. Power-hitting sophomore Lexi Overstreet will be the backup at first base.

Behind the plate, Tennessee brings back one of the toughest and most reliable backstops in the country in junior **Hannah Akamine**. Akamine, who switched jersey numbers from No. 6 to No. 12, was outstanding in her first full season as the team's starting catcher in 2013. She consistently was able to reach base, ranking fourth on the team with a .423 on-base percentage. Akamine improved offensively as the season progressed, finishing with a .285 batting average, three homers, three doubles and 19 RBIs and coming up with key hits in the Super Regionals and the WCWS. Defensively, she possesses a cannon for an arm, throwing out 13 base runners - the third-highest

single-season total in UT history. She proved herself as one of the toughest catchers in the nation last April when she withstood being run over by Ole Miss first baseman London Ladner at home plate and held onto the ball for the tag. Freshman Annie Aldrete is the backup catcher.

#### OUTFIELD/DP

Senior Melissa Davin will start in left field, returning her power swing to the Tennessee lineup. Davin caught fire in SEC season, going 5-for-9 with a homer, a double, five RBIs and four runs in UT's series sweep against Texas A&M. She also had strong showings against Auburn and Ole Miss. Davin battled back from a late-season injury and had a single in UT's 11-inning thriller against Oklahoma in Game 1 the WCWS Championship Series. Perkins will also back up Davin in left field.

Sophomore Rainey Gaffin takes over in center field and showed great promise as a rookie last year. Gaffin hit .290 with 11 extra-base hits and 24 RBIs and displayed great athleticism, stretching singles into doubles and doubles into triples. She saw most of her time as the DP in 2013, but will get her crack at her best defensive position in center. Sophomore Haley Tobler, who saw a lot of action in 2013 as a defensive substitution in right and left will be the primary backup in center.

Sophomore Lexi Overstreet takes over in right field, a position held by the legendary Kat Dotson the previous four years. Overstreet played catcher, left field, right field and DP as a freshman and stepped up whenever her number was called. The Suwanee, Ga., native brings a big bat to the lineup and could be in for a breakout year as a regular in the lineup. Freshman speedster Shaliyah Geathers will back up Overstreet in right field.

Freshman Annie Aldrete will start the season as the team's designated player in addition to serving as the No. 2 catcher. She showed fans a glimpse of her power swing, totaling six extra-base hits and nine RBIs in the fall exhibition games. Aldrete comes from a family with a strong baseball background. Her father, Richard Aldrete was an All-American for Cal and played minor league baseball and her uncle, Mike Aldrete, is the bench coach for the St. Louis Cardinals. Overstreet and Tarango could also see time at DP.

#### **PITCHING**

Tennessee will feature a pitching staff that has both experience and promise. Ace Ellen Renfroe has shined on the biggest softball stages and is coming off an amazing showing in the 2013 WCWS, relying on her speed and elite ball control to shut down Florida, Washington and Texas before engaging in one of the game's most-watched pitching duels against Oklahoma's Keilani Ricketts in the title series. She has amassed a 72-17 record, 760 strikeouts and a 1.52 career ERA and either ranks second or stands within range of second place of several of UT's pitching records (Monica Abbott has nearly untouchable numbers in all categories).

**2014 TENNESSEE SOFTBALL PREVIEW** 

Both sophomore Erin Gabriel and Cheyanne Tarango look to play major roles in the circle this season. Gabriel enjoyed early success, going 5-1 with 38 strikeouts over 29.0 frames before an injury shut her down for the rest of the year. As previously mentioned, Tarango went 6-1 with a 1.44 ERA and 33 strikeouts over 39.0 innings and shined in the Knoxville Super Regionals. Both Gabriel and Tarango were standout pitchers for the USA Softball Junior National Team a few years back, winning gold at the ISF World Championships.

Entering this fall, sophomore Rainey Gaffin had not pitched since high school, going 21-2 with a 1.71 ERA and 127 strikeouts as a senior at Legacy High School. She joins the staff as a relief pitcher and displayed tremendous talent during fall play. The Thornton, Colo., native could prove to be a late inning X-factor with the ball in her hand.

#### BASE RUNNING

Tennessee graduated a very talented base runner in Whitney Hammond, but returns a seasoned sophomore in Jennifer Burroughs, who had 12 pinch runs last season. New additions Hannah McDonald and Hannah Devotie look to make their impact as pinch runners.








### CO-HEAD COACH, 13TH SEASON AT TENNESSEE

**2011 NFCA HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE** 27TH SEASON AS A HEAD COACH CAREER RECORD: 1,119-369-2 **CAREER RECORD AT UT: 618-188-2** 

At 1,119 career victories through 26 years as a collegiate head coach, Ralph Weekly continues to set the standard for success that his teams have championed through the years. The 2011 NFCA Hall of Fame inductee is entering his 12th season as Tennessee's head coach.

The National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) honored his efforts throughout a distinguished, threedecade career that has spanned from his time in the U.S. Air Force through stops at Pacific Lutheran, Chattanooga and now Tennessee, with a 2011 induction into the NFCA Hall of Fame. Voted in by his coaching peers and with the organization consisting of just 49 previous inclusions, Weekly joined Ithaca Head Coach Deb Pallozzi in ceremonies at the annual NFCA Convention in Las Vegas. Nev., in Dec. of 2011.

Looking at his career from just a Tennessee standpoint, the honor would certainly appear well deserved. During their first 12 seasons at the University of Tennessee, Weekly and his wife, Karen, have transformed the Lady Vols from a program searching for an identity into a formidable Southeastern Conference and national contender.

Taking over the reins at UT following a 24-35 campaign in 2001, the Weeklys have long since improved the Orange & White's fortunes. They guided the Lady Vols through a three-year span from 2005-07 that saw the Big Orange top the 60-win plateau all three times and post both a runner-up finish (2007) and consecutive third-place national finishes at the Women's College World Series (2005, 2006). Tennessee is coming off another impressive four-year stretch that featured three trips to the WCWS (2010, 2012, 2013) with another national runner-up finish (2013). Under the Weeklys' direction, UT has been to six Women's College World Series in the last nine years (2005, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2013) and made 11 NCAA Regional and six NCAA Super Regional appearances.

The Tennessee softball team's 2013 season was truly one for the ages. The national runner-up Lady Vols can be proud of a long list of individual, team and program accomplishments that highlighted one of the finest seasons in Tennessee history.

The team finished the year at 52-12, marking the eighth season with 50 or more wins in program history. The Lady Vols made their sixth appearance in the Women's College World Series, all of which came in the last nine years (2005, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2013), and their second appearance in the Championship Series (2007, 2013). Tennessee went 16-6 in SEC play, finishing with the second-best regular-season record in the conference.

The Lady Vols finished the season as the national runner-up and were ranked at No. 5 in the final regular season USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll and the ESPN.com/ USA Softball Poll.

Seniors Raven Chavanne and Lauren Gibson and junior Madison Shipman were all named to the 2013 NFCA Division I All-American first team. UT has had at least one NFCA All-American in 10 consecutive years (2004-13) with multiple All-Americans in seven of those years (2006, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013). The Tennessee coaching staff was named the 2013 NFCA Southeast Region Staff of the Year.

2014 PREVIEW



In an outstanding 2012 season, Tennessee made its fifth trip in eight years to the Women's College World Series. After a strong regular season, which featured a 19-game winning streak into the SEC Tournament, the Lady Vols hosted both the NCAA Regionals and the NCAA Super Regionals. Thanks to a loaded lineup and a stellar pitching duo of sisters Ivy Renfroe and Ellen Renfroe, UT punched its ticket to Oklahoma City once again.

The 2012 squad boasted four Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Americans in first-team picks Lauren Gibson and Ellen Renfroe and second-team selections Raven Chavanne and Madison Shipman. Chavanne became just the third Lady Vol to earn three All-American nods and she was also a top-10 finalist for the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year for the second straight season.

In 2012, Tennessee featured the top defense in the nation -- a group that lead all NCAA Division I schools with a .982 fielding percentage. UT pitchers also combined for the 11th-best ERA in the country (1.58) and the team's winning percentage ranked eighth.

Starting off the 2011 season with a preseason rating of No. 4 in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches poll and bringing in the ESPN/Rise No. 1-rated recruiting class, Weekly helped guide the Lady Vols to a 49-12 overall record, the program's second SEC Tournament crown and an eighth consecutive berth to NCAA Regionals. The 2011 Tennessee squad set a new program record for single-season HR's with a staggering 69 to crush the previous high of 52 that was set back in 1996 and equaled in both 2002 & 2005. The Big Orange also led all of NCAA Division I in thing with a .348 team batting average, was seventh in the country in scoring at 6.87 runs per game and 11th in fielding percentage (.974).

While the UT squad ultimately fell in the title round of the 2011 Knoxville Regional, a site that many experts deemed the toughest in the country, to eventual WCWS team Oklahoma State, Tennessee still boasted numerous accolades. Weekly picked up his incredible 1,000th career victory on April 10 with a 9-0 (5 inn.) win at Ole Miss. Sophomores Lauren Gibson (.420 avg., eight HRs, 63 RBIs) and Raven Chavanne (.455 avg., 32 RBIs, 33 stolen bases) as well as freshman Ellen Renfroe (26-7 record, 1.50 ERA, 259 Ks in 201 innings) reaped Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American honors, while Chavanne was also selected as a Capital One Academic All-American. Renfroe was tabbed as the SEC Freshman of the Year. Chavanne ended the year as the SEC's batting average champion counting all contests at .455 while Gibson won the SEC batting title counting league match-ups only at .451. Ellen Renfroe was the SEC ERA champion counting just league contests with a 1.42 ERA.

Following the season Chavanne, Kat Dotson (.401 avg., 10 HRs, 64 RBIs), Gibson and Kelly Grieve (.376 avg., 37 RBIs, 21 stolen bases) were each invited to try out for the 2011 USA Softball Women's Senior National Team. By being chosen to the final team, Gibson and Grieve became the second and third Lady Vols all-time (Monica Abbott) to join the prestigious squad.

The 2010 slate proved a magical ride for an incredibly young squad made up of 19 players, including a total of 15 freshmen and sophomores. The Lady Vols registered a 49-15 overall record (making it eight straight 40+ win seasons) and truly peaked at the right time, rolling through their first seven games of the NCAA Tournament on the way to the program's fourth WCWS berth and another third place national finish. Along the way in NCAA action, Tennessee swept Ball State, Virginia and Louisville during the Knoxville Regional, ended No. 2 Michigan's two-year, 36game home winning streak by sweeping two consecutive contests in the NCAA Ann Arbor Super Regionals and opened the WCWS with consecutive victories over No. 3 Arizona (9-0, 5 inn.) and No. 9 Georgia (7-5) before being eliminated by the Wildcats just one win from a berth in the best-of-three championship series.

The youthful 2010 squad was guided by a quartet of upperclassmen, including senior catcher Tiffany Huff (.312 avg., seven HR's, 45 RBIs), first baseman Erinn Webb (.318 NCAA Tourney avg., nine total HR's, 34 RBIs) and designated player Nicole Kajitani (three doubles, three HR's, 22 RBIs) as well as junior center field speedster Kelly Grieve (.373 avg., 12 doubles, 30 RBIs, 26 thefts). The team was bolstered, however, by a myriad of high-profile freshmen including Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American outfielders Raven Chavanne (.455 avg., 64 runs, 95 hits, 26 RBIs, 37 steals) and Kat Dotson (SEC First-Team selection and Co-Freshman of the Year, .391 avg. 54 runs, 66 hits, 37 RBIs, 29 thefts), pitcher Ivy Renfroe (31-6 record, 2.41 ERA, 15 complete games, 235 K's in 232.1 IP) and third baseman Jessica Spigner (.350 avg., 14 doubles, eight HR's, 58 RBIs) and second baseman Lauren Gibson (.297 avg., eight doubles, six HR's, 39 RBIs).

In 2009, Tennessee went 40-18-1. Once again the Big Orange earned a berth into the NCAA Tournament, the program's sixth straight, falling in the NCAA Regionals. Led by the offensive production of Second Team Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American Huff (.399 avg., 13 doubles, eight HR's and 67 RBIs), freshman Spigner (UT freshman record 14 HR's) and sophomore Grieve (.393 avg., 79 hits, 39 stolen bases) as well as 28 victories in the circle from rookie right-hander Cat Hosfield, UT downed such foes as No. 21 Massachusetts, No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 18 LSU and No. 8 Georgia during the year.

The 2008 campaign was a success as the Weeklys guided the Big Orange to a fifth consecutive 50-win season at 50-16 overall and a fifth straight berth into the NCAA Tournament Field of 64. UT advanced to the championship game of its home-hosted NCAA Regional but dropped a 4-2 decision to eventual WCWS-participant Virginia Tech.

Under their tutelage, senior third baseman Tonya Callahan (.465 avg., 62 RBIs) broke the school record for single-season home runs with 16 in 2008 on the way to being chosen as Tennessee's second consecutive SEC Player of the Year and a finalist for both the USA Softball National Player of the Year trophy and the Honda Award for Softball while reaping UT's 15th Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-America honor since 2004.

The 2007 season was the benchmark by which all future



Lady Vol teams will be compared as the squad finished 63-8 for a new program-best winning percentage of .887. A third-straight trip to the WCWS ended with Tennessee becoming the first SEC program to reach the best-of-three NCAA Championship Series, eventually finishing as national runner-up with two wins over No. 4 Arizona and triumphs against No. 6 Northwestern and No. 7 Texas A&M. UT spent a record 11 consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll, becoming the first SEC school to reach the lofty top ranking in the league's softball history.

Four players were chosen as Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Americans in 2007 as Monica Abbott, Lindsay Schutzler, India Chiles and Callahan each garnered national honors. Abbott also picked up the prestigious USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year award and the Women's Sports Foundation's "Team Sport Athlete of the Year" trophy after registering a 50-5 record with a 0.68 ERA on the year. Chiles was the SEC's Player of the Year after hitting .459 with 44 stolen bases, while Abbott was the SEC's Pitcher of the Year. The Lady Vols led NCAA Division I in fielding percentage, winning percentage and team ERA in 2007, while picking up its first SEC regularseason title with a 23-4 league mark. For their efforts the Weeklys were chosen as the South Division Speedline Coaches of the Year, for the second time in three seasons, and as the SEC Coaches of the Year.

In 2006, the Weeklys guided the Lady Vols to a then-program-best single-season winning percentage of .836 after tallying a 61-12 record, UT's initial SEC Tournament title and WCWS victories over #1 UCLA, eventual national champion No. 3 Arizona and No. 9 Arizona State. Tennessee also led NCAA Division I in hitting by posting a staggering .342 team batting average. Pupils Sarah Fekete and Abbott led the country in batting average and pitching victories, respectively, while five Lady Vols were chosen first-team Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Americans.

The tools and chemistry were thought to be in place for success heading into the 2005 campaign, but youth abounded for UT with a roster completely devoid of a single senior. However, the 2005 season saw Tennessee reap its initial NCAA Regional and Super Regional titles and WCWS berth, tie a then-national record with 67 wins, finish third in the nation in both national polls, garner an impressive four Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-America selections and break a long-standing national mark for single-season shutouts with 51. A Super Regional sweep over No. 4 Stanford in Palo Alto, Calif., and WCWS victories over perennial national stalwarts Arizona, Alabama and eventual national champion Michigan proved that Tennessee, under the direction of the Weeklys, was officially a power to be reckoned with in the softball world. For their efforts the UT coaches were chosen as the 2005 Speedline South Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

In 2004, the club notched a then school-record 55 victories on its way to its first Eastern Division title in five years and its initial trip to NCAA Regionals since 1999. Ralph

and Karen were honored as the SEC Co-Coaches of the Year as UT finished with a final ranking of 16th from ESPN.com/ USA Softball and boasted its first All-American in freshman hurler Abbott. The 6-3 lefthander registered a staggering 582 K's and 45 victories in her initial campaign at Rocky Top.

Tennessee continued its upward movement in the SEC standings in 2003 and notched then the second-most victories in school history with a 45-25 mark. Despite being overlooked for a spot in the 64-team NCAA field, the Lady Vols made their first appearance at the SEC Tournament in four years and eliminated top-seeded and seventh-ranked Georgia and Auburn before being ousted by WCWS participant Alabama. Year one of the Weeklys' rebuilding effort proved to be a preview of better things to come for the Big Orange, as the tandem directed the squad to a 35-25-1 overall record in 2002 and the club's first winning season since 1999. Having lost the squad's top four hitters from the previous campaign and with their projected pitching ace facing a reduced schedule in the circle due to a torn ligament in her elbow, expectations were minimal. After being picked last in the Eastern Division, Tennessee responded with the best start in the program's seven-year existence at 21-6-1.

Under Ralph's watchful eye in the batting cages, Adrianna Wilson capped off an outstanding senior campaign by being named to the 2002 NFCA All-South Region team. Chosen to the organization's second unit as a rookie '99, the Cypress, Calif., native joined Carrie Swinford (1997, 1999) as the lone UT players to reap all-region accolades twice in her career. A first-team choice in her final season, Wilson became UT's initial all-region honoree since 1999.

Ralph and Karen were hired as the University of Tennessee's co-head coaches on June 19, 2001. Since that day, the duo has worked tirelessly toward building UT's reputation on the diamond.

The Weeklys arrived in Knoxville after shaping Chattanooga's softball team into one of the top programs in the South upon their arrival in 1995. The tandem piloted the Lady Mocs to consecutive NCAA appearances in 2000 and 2001, the first two automatic NCAA Regional berthe ever offered to the Southern Conference champion. In 2001, UTC sported an overall record of 49-18 and was an impressive 4-1 against SEC programs.

After accepting the co-head coaching position at UT, Ralph Weekly announced in August 2001 that he would be stepping down from his post as USA Softball National Teams Director, a position he had held since 1999. Weekly began his administrative stint with USA Softball in August 1998 after taking a leave of absence as head coach at Chattanooga.

Weekly, who is nationally and internationally recognized for his skills as a hitting clinician, was responsible for a variety of national team duties, including the general management of USA Softball's elite level international programs for both men and women. He also served as a liaison to the ASA National Team Selection Committee that is responsible for the elite level selection process for Olympic, Pan American Games and other USA Softball National Teams. In the summer of 2009, Weekly accepted a position on the USA Softball Women's National Teams Selection Committee where he will again assist in choosing the members to the prestigious U.S. softball squads from 2010-12.

Between 1998 and 2001, Weekly worked closely with the U.S. Olympic Committee (USOC) to ensure that USA Softball received adequate funding for its programs and was fully equipped with the technical assistance it needed. He was also instrumental in securing the funding for the

development of a state-of-the-art practice facility at the ARCO Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista, Calif. This facility has been used by all of the USA Softball National Teams and will continue to be an integral part of USA Softball's success.

Success has followed Weekly throughout his career, especially as a coach for USA Softball Women's National Teams. Weekly served as the hitting coach and Team Leader for the 2000 U.S. Olympic team that claimed its second-consecutive gold medal in Sydney, Australia. Earlier, he served as the hitting and third-base coach for the U.S. contingent that brought home the gold at the '96 Summer Games in Atlanta. Under his direction, USA Softball captured the gold medal at the 1994 Pan American Games qualifier in Guatemala. He was an assistant on teams that won additional gold medals at the 1994 World Games in Nova Scotia, the 1995 Pan American Games in Argentina, the 1996 South Pacific Classic in Australia, the 1997 Canada Cup, the 1999 Pan American Games in Winnipeg, Canada, the inaugural 1999 America Cup in San Diego, the 2000 European Championship in Rome, Italy, and the 2001 Hawaii Cup in Honolulu.

As a coach and National Teams Director for USA Softball, Weekly has appeared in 13 international tournaments, winning a gold medal every time. His international coaching record is a sterling 130-15 (.897). He is the only person in collegiate softball to have served on a pair of Olympic gold-medal-winning coaching staffs and to have claimed two national championships as a head coach. He also directed all facets of the USA Men's National Team from 1999-2001.

He has developed High Performance Seminars funded by the USOC to establish consistent coaching philosophies for youth coaches throughout the world. In addition, Weekly has produced several instructional tapes through USA Softball, including "Fundamentals for Future Champions." In December of 2006, Ralph and co-head coach Karen Weekly released a new instructional video entitled "Hitting the Tennessee Way." In April 2012 the Weeklys will issue a new book entitled "High-Scoring Softball," the definitive quide to offensive play.

He guided the women's East team to a gold medal at the 1994 U.S. Olympic Festival in St. Louis, Mo., one year after taking the North team to a bronze medal in the Festival held in San Antonio, Texas.

Previously, Weekly was the head coach at Pacific Lutheran in Tacoma, Wash., from 1986-94, where he compiled a 310-93 (.769) record and became one of the most successful coaches in NAIA history. In his nine years at PLU, his teams made eight trips to the NAIA Tournament, returning with national championships in 1988 and 1992, and a second-place finish in 1990. His 1991 team was ranked first in the country throughout the season.

Weekly was named the National Softball Coaches Association (NSCA) Small College Coach of the Year in 1993 and was a two-time NAIA National Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1992. Incredibly, he was chosen as the NAIA West Region Coach of the Year eight times in a nine-year span, covering the 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, 1993 and 1994 campaigns.

During the fall, he also served as an assistant football coach at PLU from 1986-93 under legendary head coach Frosty Westerling. During his time spent working on the gridiron, he helped the Lutes to three national title games and a pair of NAIA national championships (1987 & 1993). In his last year he was able to share the title-winning experience with his son Marc Weekly, an All-American quarterback and a player responsible for 10,977 yards of career total offense.

Weekly began his coaching career in the United States Air Force, where he accumulated many championships at a variety of levels. He piloted squads to three All-Armed Forces World Titles, seven state titles at the United States Softball Association (USSA) level and three USSA Western World Championships.

He has served as the chairperson of the Gatorade High School Player of the Year Selection Committee and has published numerous articles in softball magazines and journals. In addition, Weekly has been a featured speaker at the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) national convention and at various national baseball and softball clinics around the nation. He currently serves as the co-director of the Cherry Hill, N.J., Coaches Clinic which is the largest such event in the country. Weekly is the founder and director of National Hitting Camps, where he has taught thousands of youths in all 48 of the contiguous states and throughout Canada over the past 20+ years. He was also the Director of ASA Gold Medal Camps that featured hands-on training from U.S. Olympic staff and players from 1996-2001. Well-respected internationally as a clinician, he has represented the USA in clinics in Argentina, Australia, Canada, China, Italy, New Zealand and Taiwan.

Having retired from the United States Air Force in 1986, Weekly was the commander of the Air Force Office of Special Investigations at McChord Air Force Base in Washington, D.C., in his last duty assignment. He was awarded the Bronze Star and Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry for outstanding service the Vietnam War. Weekly is a 1973 graduate of Arizona State University and has completed course work for a master's degree in international relations from Pacific Lutheran.

A 17-year collegiate softball head coaching veteran boasting 841 career wins, Karen Weekly and with her husband Ralph enter their 13th season at the helm of the Lady Volunteer softball program. Having guided UT to a staggering 618 victories and five top three national finishes (2005, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2013) and six appearances (2005, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2013) in the annual Women's College World Series since arriving to resuscitate the program prior to the 2002 season, Karen and Ralph have made it evident that tireless recruiting and solid coaching by the experienced Weeklys and their staff can produce huge dividends to the UT softball program.

The Tennessee softball team's 2013 season was truly one for the ages. The national runner-up Lady Vols can be proud of a long list of individual, team and program accomplishments that highlighted one of the finest seasons in Tennessee history.

The team finished the year at 52-12, marking the eighth season with 50 or more wins in program history. The Lady Vols made their sixth appearance in the Women's College World Series, all of which came in the last nine years (2005, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2013), and their second appearance in the Championship Series (2007, 2013). Tennessee went 16-6 in SEC play, finishing with the second-best regular-season record in the conference.

The Lady Vols finished the season as the national runnerup and were ranked at No. 2 in the final USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll and the ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll.

Seniors Raven Chavanne and Lauren Gibson and junior Madison Shipman were all named to the 2013 NFCA Division I All-American first team. UT has had at least one NFCA All-American in 10 consecutive years (2004-13) with multiple All-Americans in seven of those years (2006, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013). The Tennessee coaching staff was named the 2013 NFCA Southeast Region Staff of the Year.

In an outstanding 2012 season, Tennessee made its fifth trip in eight years to the Women's College World Series. After a strong regular season which featured a 19-game winning streak into the SEC Tournament, The Lady Vols hosted both the NCAA Regionals and the NCAA Super Regionals and thanks to a loaded lineup and a stellar pitching duo of sisters lvy Renfroe and Ellen Renfroe, UT punched its ticket to Oklahoma City once again.

The 2012 squad boasted four Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Americans in first-team picks Lauren Gibson and Ellen Renfroe and second-team selections Raven Chavanne and Madison Shipman. Chavanne became just the third Lady Vol to earn three All-American nods and she was also a top-10 finalist for the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year for the second straight season.

In 2012, Tennessee featured the top defense in the nation -- a group that lead all NCAA Division I schools with a .982 fielding percentage. UT pitchers also combined for the 11th-best ERA in the country (1.58) and the team's winning percentage ranked eighth.

Starting off the 2011 season with a preseason rating of No. 4 in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches poll, boasting 13 returning letter-winners from the `10 WCWS squad and bringing in the ESPN/Rise No. 1-rated recruiting class,

2014 PREVIEW

Weekly helped guide the Lady Vols to a 49-12 overall record, the program's second SEC Tournament crown and an eighth consecutive berth to NCAA Regionals. The 2011 Tennessee squad set a new program record for singleseason HR's with a staggering 69 to crush the previous high of 52 that was set back in 1996 and equaled in both 2002 & 2005. The Big Orange also led all of NCAA Division I in hitting with a .348 team batting average, was seventh in the country in scoring at 6.87 runs per game and 11th in fielding percentage (.974).

While the UT squad ultimately fell in the title round of the 2011 Knoxville Regional, a site that many experts deemed the toughest in the country, to eventual WCWS team Oklahoma State, Tennessee still boasted numerous accolades. Sophomores Lauren Gibson (.420 avg., eight HR's, 63 RBI's) and Raven Chavanne (.455 avg., 32 RBI's, 33 stolen bases) as well as freshman Ellen Renfroe (26-7 record, 1.50 ERA, 259 K's in 201 innings) reaped Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American honors, while Chavanne was also selected as a Capital One Academic All-American. Sophomore Kat Dotson (.401 avg., 10 HR's, 64 RBI's) joined that trio in receiving a Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Southeast Region selection, and Renfroe was tabbed as the SEC Freshman of the Year. Chavanne ended up as the SEC's batting average champion counting all contests at .455 while Gibson won the SEC batting title counting league match-ups only at .451. Ellen Renfroe was the SEC ERA champion counting just league contests with a 1.42 ERA.

Following the season Chavanne, Dotson, Gibson and Kelly Grieve (.376 avg., 37 RBI's, 21 stolen bases) were each invited to try out for the 2011 USA Softball Women's Senior National Team, although Dotson was forced to withdraw prior to the selection camp because of an injury. By being chosen to the final team, Gibson and Grieve became the second and third Lady Vols all-time (Monica Abbott) to join the prestigious squad.

The 2010 campaign proved a magical ride for an incredibly young Tennessee squad made up of 19 players. including a total of 15 freshmen and sophomores. The Lady Vols registered a 49-15 overall record (making it eight straight 40+ win seasons) and truly peaked at the right time, rolling through their first seven games of the NCAA Tournament on the way to the program's fourth WCWS berth and another third place national finish. Along the way in NCAA action, Tennessee swept Ball State, Virginia and Louisville during the Knoxville Regional, ended No. 2 Michigan's two-year, 36-game home winning streak by sweeping two consecutive contests in the NCAA Ann Arbor Super Regionals and opened the WCWS with consecutive victories over No. 3 Arizona (9-0, 5 inn.) and No. 9 Georgia (7-5) before being eliminated by the Wildcats just one win from a berth in the best-of-three championship series.

The youthful 2010 squad was guided by a quartet of upperclassmen, including senior catcher Tiffany Huff (NFCA All-South Region choice, .312 avg., seven HR's, 45 RBIs), first baseman Erinn Webb (.318 NCAA Tourney avg., nine total HR's, 34 RBIs) and designated player Nicole Kajitani (three doubles, three HR's, 22 RBIs) as well as junior center field speedster Kelly Grieve (.373 avg., 12 doubles, 30 RBIs, 26 thefts). The team was bolstered, however, by a myriad of high-profile freshmen including Louisville Slugger/National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-American outfielders Raven Chavanne (.455 avg., 64 runs, 95 hits, 26 RBIs, 37 steals) and Kat Dotson (SEC First-Team selection and Co-Freshman of the Year, .391 avg., 54 runs, 66 hits, 37 RBIs, 29 thefts), pitcher Ivy Renfroe (31-6 record, 2.41 ERA, 15 complete games, 235 K's in 232.1 IP) and third baseman Jessica Spigner (.350 avg., 14



doubles, eight HR's, 58 RBIs) and second baseman Lauren Gibson (.297 avg., eight doubles, six HR's, 39 RBIs).

As a team the powerful Tennessee offense recorded a .321 batting average, scored 6.4 runs-per-game, tied the program record for triples with 19 and blasted 51 HR's. coming up just one big fly short of tying the school singleseason mark.

During the 2009 season, Tennessee continued its string of 40+ win campaigns by putting up a 40-18-1 overall record. Once again the Big Orange earned a berth into the NCAA Tournament, the program's sixth straight, falling in the NCAA Regionals. Led by the offensive production of Second Team Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American Tiffany Huff (.399 avg., 13 doubles, eight HR's and 67 RBIs), freshman All-Southeast region selection Jessica Spigner (UT freshman record 14 HR's) and sophomore All-Southeast Region choice Kelly Grieve (.393 avg., 79 hits, 39 stolen bases) as well as 28 victories in the circle from rookie right-hander Cat Hosfield, UT downed such foes as No. 21 Massachusetts, No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 18 LSU and No. 8 Georgia during the year.

The 2008 campaign was a success as the Weeklys guided the Big Orange to a fifth consecutive 50-win season and a fifth straight berth into the NCAA Tournament Field of 64. UT advanced to the championship game of its home-hosted NCAA Regional but dropped a 4-2 decision to eventual WCWS-participant Virginia Tech.

Under their tutelage, senior third baseman Tonya Callahan (.465 avg., 62 RBIs) broke the school record for single-season home runs with 16 on the way to being chosen as Tennessee's second consecutive SEC Player of the Year and a finalist for both the 2008 USA Softball National Player of the Year trophy and the Honda Award for Softball while reaping UT's 15th Louisville Slugger/National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-America honor since 2004. Senior shortstop Kenora Posey and freshman infielder Jen Lapicki each earned All-SEC accolades. Karen's slap-hitting standouts, Lillian Hammond and Kenora Posey, were responsible for .362 and .349 averages, respectively, 96 total runs scored and 67 combined stolen bases.

The 2007 season was the benchmark by which all future Lady Vol teams will be compared as the squad finished at 63-8 for a new program-best win percentage of .887. A third-straight trip to the Women's College World Series ended with Tennessee becoming the first Southeastern Conference program to reach the best-of-three NCAA Championship Series, eventually finishing as national runner-up with two wins over No. 4 Arizona and single triumphs against No. 6 Northwestern and No. 7 Texas A&M.



UT spent a record 11 consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the ESPN. com/USA Softball poll, becoming the first SEC school to reach the lofty top ranking in the league's softball history.

Four players were chosen as Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Americans in 2007 as Monica Abbott, Lindsay Schutzler, India Chiles and Callahan each garnered national honors. Abbott also picked up the prestigious USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year award and the Women's Sports Foundation's Team Sport Athlete of the Year trophy after going 50-5 with a 0.68 ERA on the year. Chiles was the SEC's Player of the Year after hitting .459 with 44 stolen bases. The Lady Vols led NCAA Division I in fielding percentage, winning percentage and team ERA in 2007 while picking up its first SEC regular-season title. For their efforts the Weeklys were South Division Speedline Coaches of the Year, for the second time in three seasons, and as the SEC Coaches of the Year. Karen Weekly also presided over her 500th career coaching victory on February 24, 2007, when UT downed Michigan State, 3-0, at the Palm Springs Classic in Cathedral City, Calif.

Weekly's tutelage helped guide Tennessee to a thenprogram-best .836 winning percentage in 2006 at 61-12 overall, a No. 2 national ranking during the regular season and a second consecutive trip to the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City, Okla., where UT finished third nationally and downed #1 UCLA, #3 Arizona and #9 Arizona State. One of her slap-hitting pupils, senior outfielder Sarah Fekete, led NCAA Division I in batting average at a staggering .500 (110-of-220) as the UT squad combined to lead the country in team hitting at .342. In all three of the top five hitters in the Southeastern Conference by average in 2006 learned under the watchful eye of Karen and co-head coach Ralph Weekly, as Fekete, Chiles (.437) and Schutzler (.409) gave the league statistics a definitive orange tint. Five members of Weekly's team also were selected as first-team Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Americans to lead NCAA Division I in that category.

UT also achieved another program-first in `06 as the Orange & White raced through the field at the annual SEC Tournament to pick up its first league tournament title with a 3-0 victory over #12 LSU at the UGA Softball Stadium in Athens, Ga. UT hosted the NCAA Regional round at home for the second straight year and added the Super Regionals to the Tyson Park slate after roaring through the opening round a perfect 3-0. The Big Orange faced a serious challenge as defending national champion Michigan ventured to Knoxville for the best-of-three Super Regional series. After downing UM 5-3 and then dropping a tough 5-1 decision to the Wolverines in game two, UT prevailed 1-0 in the finale to send the Orange and White back to the WCWS.

Throughout the Weeklys tenure at Tennessee, the Big Orange have been known for tremendous speed, skyrocketing batting averages and outstanding fielding percentages, as UT led the nation in the latter category in both 2004, 2005 and 2007.

The Orange's and White rapid climb from a 24-win program in 2001 to a national power reached a new peak during a stunning 2005 run to a third-place finish at the Women's College World Series and a national record-tying 67 victories. UT led the nation in fielding percentage (.982), shutouts (51), strikeouts (787) and victories (67) while setting program marks for runs scored (404), hits (678) and stolen bases (127) and tying the single-season record for home runs (52). Tennessee's regular-season efforts permitted the program the opportunity to host the NCAA Regionals at Tyson Park for the first time in UT history. The home field advantage paid dividends as the Lady Vols went



3-0 to advance to NCAA Super Regionals in Palo Alto, Calif., against Stanford. A two-game road sweep over the powerful Pac-10's Cardinal granted Tennessee its first trip to the WCWS. For their efforts the coaches were chosen as the Speedline South Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

The Weeklys were honored as the SEC Coaches of the Year by their peers after directing UT to its first Eastern Division championship since 1999 during the 2004 campaign. The Orange was awarded the second seed at NCAA Regional No. 6 in Ann Arbor, Mich., and collected its first two victories in just the program's second trip to NCAAs. The Lady Vols sported an overall mark of 55-16 and captured tournament titles at their own Lady Vol Classic, the New Mexico State Kick-Off Invitational, the Paradise Classic hosted by the University of Hawaii and the State-Line Classic. Tennessee also reached the semifinal round of the SEC Tournament for the second straight time.

UT continued to climb the ladder of success in 2003, capturing three tournaments and posting several victories over ranked opponents, including league rivals Alabama, Georgia, LSU and South Carolina. Perhaps the most impressive breakthrough occurred as the Lady Vols secured the sixth seed for the Southeastern Conference Tournament and matched their top performance at the event with a couple of triumphs while facing elimination. The Orange were involved in a record four extra-inning tilts during their journey to Plant City, Fla., and managed to oust Auburn and the league's number-one team, Georgia, after dropping regular-season series to the Tigers and Bulldogs.

Continued evidence of the team's progress was shown by a 34-point increase in batting average from 2002 to 2003 under the Weekly regime and a healthy boost to the squad's power numbers, including the most total bases (787), hits (543), runs batted in (280), runs (310) and doubles (102) since the 1999 edition slugged its way to the Eastern Division crown and NCAA Regional No. 3 in Seattle, Wash.

In their debut campaign, the Weeklys presided over the biggest turnaround in UT's softball history, as the team rebounded from a lackluster 24-35 effort to finish 35-25-1 in 2002. The Lady Vols showed marked improvement in every area - offensively, defensively and in the pitching circle. Despite just one returning starter in her natural position, the rest of the orange-clad players enjoyed a tremendous upswing under the Weeklys' tutelage. In fact, UT registered a team batting average that was 40 points higher than the previous season and recorded a school-record fielding percentage of .965 after shaving a massive 44 errors off its '01 figure. In addition, the club's offensive statistics jumped

across the board, including a school-record-tying 52 home runs.

Upon arriving in Knoxville, Weekly brought a wealth of experience gained from being an All-America softball player at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Wash., a national title-winning assistant coach at PLU in 1988 and 1992, and a championship head coach at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga for five seasons. During her tenure, the Lady Mocs claimed five straight Southern Conference regularseason trophies, four SoCon Tournament plaques and the team made successive appearances at the 2000 and 2001 NCAA Regionals.

After Karen served as an assistant coach at UTC in 1995 and 1996, the Weeklys combined their efforts to direct the Lady Mocs to the top of the SoCon in their first two campaigns in charge of the program together. The 1997 season featured an overall record of 32-19, while the '98 edition registered a school-record 47 victories and three players earned first-team All-South Region accolades.

While Ralph was on a leave of absence from Chattanooga to handle his Olympic duties in 1999 and 2000, the Lady Mocs' program continued to make steady improvement under Karen's tutelage. In her initial season as head coach in '99, UTC led the SoCon with a .303 batting average and a 1.47 earned run average en route to a school-best 48-18 overall record to go along with a spotless 16-0 mark in regular-season conference play. Weekly guided a record six individuals to first-team All-SoCon accolades that season and Chattanooga became the inaugural team to sweep all of the postseason honors issued by the conference office.

In 2000, the Lady Mocs were 47-27 and earned the program's first NCAA Regional berth by winning three-straight games after a loss to Furman to take the SoCon Tourney and secure the initial automatic bid for the conference into the 48-team regional field. Sent to the No. 1 Regional held in Seattle, Wash., the Mocs fell to Mississippi State, 6-1, before bouncing back to knock out Army, 6-4, in nine innings. The squad would later be eliminated at the event after suffering a 2-1 defeat to nationally-ranked Utah. UTC's pitching staff was the key to its success, sporting an impressive 1.58 earned run average with every hurler having an ERA of 1.80 or lower.

In rolling to a 49-18 overall mark in 2001, including four wins in five outings against SEC competition and a triumph over then-third-ranked Alabama in Tuscaloosa, the Weeklys helped the Mocs to another NCAA appearance following Southern Conference regular-season and post-season crowns. Six more Lady Mocs etched their names on the first-team all-league list after UTC racked up an 18-2 ledger in SoCon play and the Weeklys were selected as league Coaches of the Year.

Karen was Ralph's top assistant at Pacific Lutheran from

1987-94 after earning her bachelor's degree in history and political science magna cum laude from the University in 1987. The duo spearheaded the Lutes to NAIA national championships in 1988 and 1992 and a runner-up finish in 1990.

At PLU, where she was known as Karen Kvale, Weekly excelled as a student-athlete. She was named Female Athlete of the Year and led NAIA hitters with a .440 batting average during her All-America senior season. Her skills were not limited to the diamond either, as she was a three-year starter on the basketball team.

With a 3.8 grade point average, Weekly was a two-time Academic All-American, garnering honors in 1986 and 1987. In both '85 and '86, she was the recipient of the prestigious Pacific Lutheran University Undergraduate Fellow/Division of Social Sciences Award.

She later earned her juris doctor degree from the University of Washington's School of Law in 1990. At Chattanooga, Weekly was an assistant professor in the College of Business Administration from August 1995 until May 2001, where she taught a course entitled the "Legal Environment of Business." From 1996-99, she served on the UTC Faculty Committee on Student Rating of Faculty Instruction. In addition, Weekly was an administrative law judge and a member of the school's Gender Equity Committee from 1996 until her departure from Chattanooga. She remains an administrative law judge at the University of Tennessee.

Previously, she was an associate attorney at Grant, Konvalinka & Harrison in Chattanooga from November 1994 to August 1995 after working in a similar capacity at Williams, Kastner & Gibbs in Seattle from September 1990 through November 1994.

Weekly holds memberships in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA), where she has held several committee positions, and the Academy of Legal Studies in Business. She is a member of the American Bar Association and is permitted to practice law in the states of Tennessee and Washington.

Having traveled all over the nation to spread her knowledge about the sport, Weekly has been a co-owner and director of National Hitting Camps since 1988. She also has been a lead instructor at ASA Elite Hitting Camps in Midland, Texas, and in Oklahoma City, Okla., and has been a featured speaker at several coaching clinics around the country. She has spoken at the "Be the Best You Are" clinic in Cherry Hill, N.J., during each of the last six years, covering such topics as developing power and bat speed, the short game, scouting opponents and developing a rapport between the coach and players.

In December 2007, Weekly released a video entitled "The Tennessee Slap Attack," an instructional tape teaching the fundamentals of slap-hitting. In April 2012 the Weeklys will issue a new book entitled "High-Scoring Softball," the definitive guide to offensive play.

Weekly is currently serving as a member of the coaching pool for the various teams associated with the prestigious USA Softball program. She traveled to the Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista, Calif., in June 2011 to help with the USA Softball Women's Senior National Team Selection Camp.

In the summer of 2012, she served as an assistant coach on the U.S. Senior National Team, helping lead the squad to a title in the World Cup of Softball VII, a second-place showing in the Canadian Open Championship and a silver medal in the ISF Fastpitch World Championships in Canads She also served as head coach for the 2012 Elite Team.

Lauded for his teaching ability and his overall knowledge of the game, Marty McDaniel continues to provide his outgoing personality and boundless enthusiasm to the Lady Vol softball program as a ninth-year assistant coach on the staff of Tennessee Co-Head Coaches Ralph and Karen Weekly. A former head coach at Division II Armstrong Atlantic State University (Ga.), McDaniel's experience as both a coach and as a men's fastpitch veteran has been invaluable to the UT efforts.

During his time on the UT softball staff. McDaniel has been vital to the program's stunning success. His pitching pupils such as standouts Monica Abbott, Megan Rhodes, Ashton Ward, Cat Hosfield, Ivy Renfroe and Ellen Renfroe have helped extend Tennessee's streak of 40+ win seasons to 11 following the 2013 campaign. During his nine years at Tennessee (2005-13) his staffs have led the nation in ERA and strikeouts (2007), set a national record for shutouts (51 in 2005) and helped the Big Orange to 483 total victories, an average of 54 wins-per-season.

Sisters Ivy Renfroe and Ellen Renfroe were outstanding in the circle once again in 2013, leading Tennessee back to the Women's College World Series for the sixth time in nine years. UT posted 22 shutouts in 2013 and limited opponents just two runs per game. The team's ERA of 1.84 ranked 13th in the nation. Ellen Renfroe shined in the WCWS, earning All-Tournament honors after dominating complete-game performances against Florida and Washington and a courageous 13-strikeout, 11-inning duel with Oklahoma's Keilani Ricketts in the Championship Series.

Powered by the 1-2 punch the Renfroe sisters in 2012, the Tennessee pitching staff posted the 11th-best ERA in the nation (1.58). Ellen Renfroe went on to earn her second Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-America honors after another stellar year in the circle. Ivy Renfroe raised her game to another level in the NCAA Tournament, compiling a 6-2 record with a 1.29 ERA and 39 strikeouts in 48.2 innings of work to carry UT to the Women's College World Series.

With the addition of freshman Ellen Renfroe to a Lady Vol staff already made up of returning sister Ivy and Hosfield, the UT pitching staff registered a standout 2011 campaign. The trio combined to rate second in the league in team ERA (1.86) and 23rd in the category over all of NCAA Division I. Ellen Renfroe led the SEC in ERA (counting league contests only) with a sterling 1.42 mark on her way to SEC Freshman of the Year accolades and posted a 26-7 overall mark (fourth in the SEC in wins) to go along with a 1.50 ERA and 259 strikeouts over 201 innings. Included in her efforts were a 20-strikeout effort during a 2-1 (10 inn.) victory over #22 Auburn and seven total 10+K contests. Ivy Renfroe finished seventh in the league in triumphs, as part of her 19-4 record, and ninth in ERA (counting all games) at 2.07 while posting 157 K's in 152.1 frames of effort. The Jackson, Tenn., native also twirled her second (vs. Mississippi State - April 22) and third (vs. Liberty - May 20) career no-hitters during her sophomore campaign. As a junior Hosfield added a 4-1 mark with a 2.92 ERA over 38.1 innings of work with 24 strikeouts.

Faced with an young and inexperienced staff consisting of returning sophomores Cat Hosfield and Jessica Spigner and two incoming freshmen, Ivy Renfroe and Andi Williamson, McDaniel helped the 2010 group settle in to post 49 wins, the league's fifth-best ERA at 2.78 and 12 shutouts. His new pupil Renfroe truly thrived under his direction, posting

a 31-6 mark with a 2.41 ERA, 15 complete games and 235 strikeouts over 232.1 innings of work. She became the first Lady Vol pitcher not named Monica Abbott to win 30 or more games in a single season and post a victory at the

in ERA at 1.12 with a 61-12 overall record, 37 shutouts and 682 strikeouts. Junior All-American Abbott led the nation in victories with 44 and broke the SEC career records for K's and triumphs during the regular-season after posting a 44-10 mark with 531 K's. Sophomore Rhodes continued her rapid improvement by going 17-2 overall with a 1.40 ERA and 148 strikeouts in just 120 innings of work. The staff hurled three consecutive no-hitters during the titlewinning USF adidas Tournament and almost got a fourth straight as a bloop single by UMass in the fifth inning of the championship contest broke up the amazing bid.

Working primarily with the pitching and catching positions during the record-setting 2005 campaign, McDaniel instructed a group of hurlers that broke a long-standing national record for shutouts with 51 blankings while helping guide UT's initial advance into the WCWS. The first-year McDaniel's charges combined for 67 victories in the circle with an overall ERA of 0.79 and 787 strikeouts in 547.0 innings. Sophomore Abbott became the program's first two-time, first-team All-American after leading the nation in victories (50), shutouts (34), strikeouts (603) and innings pitched (392.0). Rookie pitcher Rhodes posted 14 victories and 125 K's on her way to SEC All-Freshman honors

Granted the responsibility of building the softball program at Armstong Atlantic State (Ga.) from its infancy in 1998, McDaniel turned the AASU varsity program into a winning machine that captured its initial Peach Belt Conference championship in 2000, garnered four NCAA Championship berths (2000, 2002, 2003, 2004) and achieved a No. 1 ranking in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) poll during the 2000 campaign. His conference-winning squad in 2000 picked up an impressive 51 victories against just seven losses and registered an 18-2 league mark in PBC play.

With the assistance of four All-Americans, McDaniel's 2004 AASU squad advanced all the way to the South Atlantic Regional. Record-setting senior pitcher Katya Eronina picked up her second-consecutive first-team NFCA All-America honor while a pair of seniors, Stacey Richardson and Kissy Stepanova, garnered second-team All-America awards. Junior second baseman Stacy Oliver was selected as a third-team All-American.

During the 2003 campaign, AASU utilized the pitching of NFCA All-America Eronina, the Division II leader in earnedrun-average, to advance to the South Atlantic Region final. The Pirates achieved a final ranking of 16th and completed the season at 41-13 overall.

All-Americans Annie Sells and Richardson helped guide the 2002 version of McDaniel's Pirates to a No. 2-seeding at the South Atlantic Regional and another final ranking of 16th. AASU registered the best won-lost record in Division II with a 40-7 mark while Richardson was the NCAA's DII home run champion with a school-record 16 round-trippers. The squad finished with a 15-2 mark for a second-place finish in the Peach Belt Conference.

The 2000 South Atlantic Coach of the Year, McDaniel has had experience on the Weeklys' staff before as he joined AASU from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. During his two-plus year stint on the staff of then Head Coach Ralph Weekly, also a U.S. Olympic Assistant Coach, Chattanooga won two Southern Conference Championships.

A native of Chattanooga, Tenn., McDaniel received his Bachelor of Science degree from Carson-Newman College in 1989 and also assisted with the baseball team as a coach for two seasons. As a top-rated pitcher, McDaniel has made numerous all-region squads in the sport of men's fastpitch softball.

During 2008 he was honored in a ceremony at Armstong Atlantic State as a coaching inductee into the softball program's "Wall of Fame."

McDaniel and his wife, the former Kelly Stewart, currently reside in Knoxville, Tenn. The pair have a child, Lindsey Jo, who was born during the 2005 softball campaign.

annual Women's College World Series. The 6-0 right hander registered perhaps her finest effort during NCAA Super Regionals at No. 2 Michigan, flirting with a no-hitter for 6.1 frames before settling for a two-hit shutout to end the powerful Wolverines two-year, 36-game home winning streak. Renfroe also three-hit eventual national finalist No. 3 Arizona in UT's WCWS opener as Tennessee rolled past the Wildcats, 9-0 (5 inn.). Hosfield was solid from the circle in support in 2010, registering a 17-8 overall mark with a 3.27 ERA with six complete games and 130 K's in 171.1 innings. During her campaign, the Murfreesboro, Tenn., product posted victories over high-profile foes including No. 15 Texas, Illinois State, Ole Miss, Auburn, No. 4 Florida, Louisville and No. 2 Michigan. Typically a third baseman, Spigner recorded a pitching win over Austin Peay and picked up a crucial save during a 5-4 home triumph over No. 9 Georgia, while Williamson allowed just a single tally in five innings of work over three appearances.

Rookie righthander Hosfield led the way for the Lady Vol pitching crew in 2009, posting a 28-13 record with six solo shutouts and 221 strikeouts in 257.1 innings of work. She tied for 12th in NCAA Division I in wins, second in the Southeastern Conference in victories, rated fourth in strikeouts (221) and 11th in opposing batting average (.222), while posting high-profile victories over No. 6 Oklahoma (twice), No. 15 Massachusetts, No. 18 LSU (twice), No. 25 Kansas and Auburn (three wins). Included in her SEC All-Freshman campaign was a hardfought 2-1 defeat to eventual national champion Washington, during which Hosfield allowed just two runs on seven hits in a duel with 2009 USA Softball National Player of the Year Danielle Lawrie. Forced to look further into the staff as the long '09 season wore on, he helped senior Danielle Pieroni to an 8-3 mark over 57 innings of work after she entered the year with all of 22.2 frames of collegiate pitching experience. He even helped freshman Spigner, who hadn't thrown in a pitch in nearly a year, contribute 16 innings, including a big 6-3 win at No. 8 Georgia.

His charges in the circle helped guide Tennessee to a fifth consecutive 50-win campaign in 2008 while posting 17 shutouts, a 2.10 team ERA and 431 K's in 437.0 innings of work. Freshman righthander Ward spent the season among the SEC win leaders and finished 25th in NCAA Division I in victories by going 27-5 overall with a team-best 1.88 ERA and 187 strikeouts. Senior Rhodes was responsible for 23 triumphs, 213.1 innings of work and 233 K's. The Nashville, Tenn., native concluded her time wearing the Orange & White firmly entrenched in the Lady Vol top four in career wins, K's, shutouts, ERA, appearances, starts and winning percentage. Junior Pieroni demonstrated improvement in the circle during 2008 by working 19.1 frames and highlighting her year with 2.2 innings of scoreless relief in an exhibition contest against the U.S. Olympic Softball Team.

During the 2007 drive to a runner-up national finish at the Women's College World Series, McDaniel helped the Tennessee staff to an NCAA-best 0.88 ERA to go along with 63 wins, 41 shutouts and a national single-season record strikeout-per-seven-inning ratio of 13.55 on 910 combined K's over 470 innings of work. His pupils in the circle, Abbott and Rhodes, finished first (14.1) and fourth (11.7), respectively, in K-per-seven-inning ratio in the country. Senior Abbott led the way in single-season strikeouts with an NCAA record 724. She completed her stay in the Orange & White as the NCAA career leader in wins (189), strikeouts (2,440), shutouts (112), appearances (253) and innings pitched (1,448.0). Rhodes struck out 186 batters over just 111.2 frames of work while going 13-3 with a 1.50 ERA. The duo also combined to hurl eight no-hitters, including three perfect games (two for Abbott, one for Rhodes). For his efforts, he was named as part of Speedline's South Region Coaching Staff of the Year for the second time in three seasons (2005).

His pitching staff continued their stellar work in the circle during UT's run to the WCWS in 2006 by leading the league

Lawson should be a familiar face to Lady Vol softball fans as he has orchestrated UT softball regular-season and postseason games in recent years. ## DR. JIMMY G. CHEEK

## **UT KNOXVILLE CHANCELLOR**

FIFTH YEAR AT TENNESSEE TEXAS A&M '69

Dr. Jimmy G. Cheek became the seventh chancellor of the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, on Feb. 1, 2009.

Through his leadership, the campus is focused on improving the student's educational experience, enhancing faculty research and scholarship as well as outreach and service. A first-generation college student, Dr. Cheek has set in motion several initiatives to broaden UT Knoxville's diversity and student access to the university.

As the state's flagship research campus, UT Knoxville is currently ranked as a Top 50 public institution. In early 2010, the campus launched its quest to become one of the Top 25 public research universities in the nation. It helped solidify strategies for growing the research base and graduate programs, improving graduation rates and attracting and retaining top faculty.

Dr. Cheek chairs the Board of the International Fertilizer Development Center Advisory Committee, a new global research effort to develop and commercialize clean, environmentally sustainable, cost-effective and renewable fertilizers for the developing world. He serves of the board of directors for the Association of Public and Land Grant Universities (APLU), as chairman of the group's Commission on Food, Environment and Renewable Resources and as a member of the APLU Presidential Advisory Committee on Energy. He serves on the UT-Battelle Board of Governors, the UT Health Sciences Center Board of Directors, the Tennessee Higher Education Commission Master Plan Steering Committee and the UT Athletics Board of Directors.

Prior to his UT appointment, Dr. Cheek was a member of the faculty and an administrator at the University of Florida for 34 years, last serving as senior vice president of agricultural and natural resources.

Dr. Cheek earned his bachelor's degree with high honors and his doctorate from Texas A&M University. He received his master's degree from Lamar University. A native of Texas, he is married to lleen, and they have two children and two grandchildren.



## DR. DONALD BRUCE

## **FACULTY ATHLETIC REPRESENTATIVE**

15TH YEAR AT TENNESSEE DREW UNIVERSITY '94

Donald Bruce is the Douglas and Brenda Horne Professor of Business in the Center for Business and Economic Research (CBER) and the Department of Economics at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville.

He joined the UTK faculty in 1999 after receiving his M.A. and Ph.D. in Economics from Syracuse University and his B.A. with honors in Economics from Drew University.

As a CBER economist, Dr. Bruce regularly provides objective, non-partisan policy research and evaluation under contracts with an array of government agencies at the federal and state levels. His recent work in CBER has included an ongoing evaluation of Tennessee's welfare program, Families First, for the Tennessee Department of Human Services, an analysis of teacher supply and demand in Tennessee for the Governor's Office of Education Policy, and a forecast of expenditures on Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarships for the Tennessee Higher Education Commission.

In addition to his CBER research, Dr. Bruce studies the economic and behavioral effects of tax policies on such things as small business activity and owner-occupied housing. His work has been presented and published in a variety of academic journals, edited volumes, and professional meetings. He has testified before Congress on the topic of internet taxation, and he presented his work on taxes and small business activity before the President's

Advisory Panel on Federal Tax Reform in 2005.

Dr. Bruce regularly teaches graduate and undergraduate courses on the economics of taxation and the economics of health and health care. He has recently served as the Director of Graduate Studies in Economics and the Director of the Undergraduate Major in Public Administration. Before becoming Faculty Athletics Representative, Dr. Bruce served for two years as chair of the Athletics Board's Fiscal Integrity and Long-Range Planning Committee. He has also served as chair of the UTK Faculty Senate's Budget and Planning Committee. Dr. Bruce is an active member of the National Tax Association, the International Institute of Public Finance, and the American, Southern, and Western Economic Associations. His community service has included numerous economic and policy presentations for state and local organizations, volunteer assistance for the Blount County 4-H Program, and a three-year term on the Board of Directors of the Lisa Ross Birth and Women's Center, with two of those years as Treasurer.

Dr. Bruce lives in Walland, Tenn, with his wife Jennifer, a mathematics professor at Maryville College, and their daughter Annie, age 5.



## **DAVE HART**

## VICE CHANCELLOR/DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

## THIRD YEAR AT TENNESSEE ALABAMA '71

The University of Tennessee named Dave Hart vice chancellor and director of athletics on Sept. 5, 2011. Hart has held leadership roles in athletics administration at East Carolina University, Florida State University and the University of Alabama.

"Dave has done an excellent job of positioning our athletics department to achieve excellence both on the field and in the classroom," said University of Tennessee Chancellor Jimmy G. Cheek. "Our first priority is the student-athlete; Dave has made that his goal from the first day he arrived on campus."

Among the many challenges and goals being addressed in the first two years of his tenure at Tennessee, Hart has led efforts which included the following:

- Restructured the athletics department and developed an organizational flow chart.
- Redefined the athletic department Mission Statement to focus on the student-athlete.
- Created a new Governance Structure going through a "right-sizing" effort in conjunction with the implementation of combining the men and women's athletic programs into one while setting a direction and vision for all units within the department
- The Compliance Department has been reorganized and capital projects have been reprioritized to dovetail into a strategic plan, which is in the process of being finalized, for the next 5-to-10 years.
- Policies and procedures have been strengthened throughout the department, as has overall communication.
- Fan experience enhancement options at Neyland Stadium and Thompson-Boling Arena have been prioritized as well.

In December, Hart hired Butch Jones from the University of Cincinnati as the head football coach at the University of Tennessee. Since assuming his new role, Jones has brought a renewed sense of energy and optimism to the program as the Vols approach his first season at the helm.

Hart also hired Holly Warlick to follow the legendary Pat Summitt as the head coach of Tennessee's women's basketball program, and Warlick led the Lady Vols to the SEC championship, an Elite Eight appearance, and a 27-8 record in her first season

In 2012-13, Tennessee also won national championships in three events and finished third nationally in women's swimming and diving under Matt Kredich, the former UT women's coach whom Hart chose to lead a combined men's and women's swimming and diving program. Hart also hired Brian Pensky to lead the Tennessee soccer program, and the squad made an NCAA tournament appearance in Pensky's first season. Also last year, the men's golf program reached the final round of the NCAA tournament.

In just under two years at Tennessee, Hart has worked with Chancellor Jimmy Cheek and Provost Susan Martin to strengthen the long-term financial model for Tennessee Athletics while making considerable strides in improving the academic support structure for UT student-athletes, including the hiring of Dr. Joe Scogin as senior associate athletics director and assistant provost to lead the Thornton Student Life Center.

Comprehensive athletic success exemplified Hart's tenure as the Florida State athletic director, as a combined 35 ACC Championships were won by 10 different Seminole athletic program during his tenure. Additionally, the Seminole football team won nine ACC titles and appeared in four national championship

games, winning the 1999 BCS National Championship with a Sugar Bowl victory over Virginia Tech.

The men's outdoor track and field team also claimed two national championships during his tenure, while the baseball program appeared in the College World Series five times and the softball program won nine ACC titles and played in the Women's College World Series. During Hart's last year at Florida State, the Seminoles finished 15th in the Directors' Cup, an all-time high for the institution at that time.

Additionally, during Hart's three years at Alabama, the Crimson Tide football team claimed the 2009 BCS National Championship and the individual athletic teams posted a combined eight top-three finishes nationally over the last three years. Hart has more than 20 years of service as a director of athletics.

"It is a privilege to be Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics at the University of Tennessee," Hart said. "To be entrusted to lead one of the nation's elite athletics programs is an exciting opportunity and one that I cherish."

Highly respected as a visionary and industry leader, Hart's career has featured service as the president of both the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the Division IA Athletics Directors' Association. A former recipient of the Robert R. Neyland Award honoring lifetime achievement, Hart has also been named by his colleagues as the Athletic Director of the Year for the Southeast Region in both 2000 and 2005, one of a few select individuals to receive the honor multiple times.

During his 13 years at Florida State, Hart negotiated unprecedented, multi-million dollar contracts for the department totaling in excess of \$175 million. He also devised and executed an extensive and comprehensive facilities master plan for athletics that eclipsed the \$150 million mark. Hart initiated a multi-faceted Student Development/Life Skills program for all student-athletes at FSU, an endeavor recognized nationally as a "Program of Excellence" by the Division I-A Athletics Directors' Association. He spearheaded the rewriting of the department's mission statement to put the student-athlete at the core of athletic department priorities in its goal to build comprehensive excellence throughout all components of the department.

"Dave is as good an athletic director as there is in the country," legendary Florida State Head Football Coach Bobby Bowden said. "He's as sharp of an AD as I've been around in 57 years. He knows what's important, and he's a builder."

Hart took a leadership role in the FSU athletics department's first major capital campaign, in concert with Seminole Boosters, which raised more than \$75 million for athletics facilities and served as the catalyst for a subsequent effort. Within the Facilities Master Plan,

there were several state-of-the-art facilities constructed, including a soccer/softball facility, a state-of-the-art golf facility and teaching center, a basketball training center and major renovations to the tennis and volleyball facilities.

The Moore Athletics Center and Dick Howser Baseball Stadium ranked among the nation's best. A new aquatics facility and a renovation to the track facility were finalized in 2008.

In recognizing Hart's position within intercollegiate athletics, ACC Commissioner John Swofford said, "Dave Hart is one of the best and most respected athletics administrators in the business. He thoroughly understands the nuances of major college athletics, and he has superb values to go along with his vast experience in the field. He is a proven leader at the conference and national levels."

While at FSU, Hart made many key hires, including the hiring of FSU's first two African-American basketball coaches, including current men's coach Leonard Hamilton, as well as their first African-American senior-level administrator. Under Hart's direction, FSU formalized a varsity club to encourage the participation of former student-athletes in athletic department activities. He also placed a significant focus on the growth of women's athletics at FSU, a commitment reflected in increased funding, competitive success and facility upgrades.

Academic success also accompanied Hart's time at FSU, as the school became home to the inaugural National Student-Athlete of the Year, a State of Florida Woman of the Year recipient, and two Rhodes Scholars. A record number of FSU student-athletes made the ACC Academic Honor Roll, were recipients of NCAA post-graduate scholarship awards and obtained degrees. Student-athlete community service involvement became a priority under Hart with student-athletes contributing more than 5,000 hours in community outreach projects.

Hart has also earned the Athletics Directors' Award for advancing the quality and progress of student-athletes and the athletics program while at Florida State. In 2008, he received the James J. Corbett Award, the highest honor bestowed by National Association of College Directors of Athletics.

Hart's commitment to service includes considerable time on numerous national and conference committees, including the NCAA Council, the NCAA Honors and Awards Committee and the NCAA Special Events and Postseason Bowls Committee, and he has been a consultant to the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Council.

Hart was one of 11 athletic directors nationally who worked with an advisory group of athletic directors to presidents and conference commissioners in ongoing meetings and discussions regarding post-season football format options and similar issues related to the football postseason. In addition to his prominent leadership roles nationally, Hart chaired and had direct involvement with the renegotiations of both of the ACC's football and basketball television contracts and chaired the ACC Television Committee as well as the ACC Men's Basketball and Football committees.

He also served as Chairman of the NCAA Football Board of Directors where he represented NACDA and served with commissioners of Division I-A conferences as well as past NCAA President Myles Brand.

Hart served as Executive Director of Athletics at Alabama from August 2008 until accepting his leadership role with the Volunteers. A 1971 Alabama graduate, Hart played basketball for the Crimson Tide under legendary head coach C.M. Newton and earned a master's degree from UA in 1972 while working as a graduate assistant basketball coach.

A popular speaker at the national level, Hart has made numerous speaking presentations nationally and presented seminars on such topics as student-athlete welfare, marketing, gender equity, facility master planning, negotiation skills and personnel transition. He was an instructor at the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics Management Institute for 10 years and currently is an annual presenter at the Division I-A Athletics Directors' Institute sharing with peers his knowledge and experiences relating to athletics administration.

Hart met his wife, the former Pam Humble, while at Alabama. Pam is a 1970 graduate of The University of Alabama, and the couple has three children: Rick, who serves currently as the athletic director at SMU, Jamie and Kelly. The Harts are the grand-parents of five grandchildren: Trevor, Caroline, McKinley, Olivia and Kingsley.



The Tennessee softball team's 2013 season was truly one for the ages. The national runner-up Lady Vols can be proud of a long list of individual, team and program accomplishments that highlighted one of the finest seasons in Tennessee history.

The team finished the year at 52-12, marking the eighth season with 50 or more wins in program history. The Lady Vols made their sixth appearance in the Women's College World Series, all of which came in the last nine years (2005, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2013), and their second appearance in the Championship Series (2007, 2013). Tennessee went 16-6 in SEC play, finishing with the second-best regular-season record in the conference.

The Lady Vols finished the season as the national runner-up and were ranked at No. 5 in the final regular season USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll and the ESPN. com/USA Softball Poll.

Seniors Raven Chavanne and Lauren Gibson and junior Madison Shipman were all named to the 2013 NFCA Division I All-American first team. UT has had at least one NFCA All-American in 10 consecutive years (2004-13) with multiple All-Americans in seven of those years (2006, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013).

Chavanne hit .435 (19th nationally) with a career highs of seven home runs, 33 RBIs, 70 runs and 41 stolen bases. She was named the Capital One Academic All-American of the Year and was also a Top 3 Finalist for USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year and a finalist for the Senior Class Award. She was also a First Team All-SEC. an SEC All-Defensive Team and an SEC All-Tournament selection. Chavanne completed her incredible UT career as the school's all-time leader in batting average (.442), runs (244), on-base percentage (.509) and stolen bases (143). She was a four-time All-American and a three-time first-team pick (2011, 2012, 2013). Chavanne and Monica Abbott (2004, 2005, 2006, 2007) are the only four-time All-Americans in Tennessee softball history. Chavanne maintained the same level of excellence in the classroom as she was also a three-time first-team Academic All-American (2011, 2012, 2013)

Gibson also had a career-best year as a senior, hitting .401 with personal highs of 19 home runs (15th-most in nation), 68 RBIs, 14 doubles, 68 runs, a .538 on-base percentage and a .802 slugging percentage. Gibson

was the 2013 SEC Player of the Year and earned NFCA All-American first-team honors for the third consecutive year (2011, 2012, 2013). She became just the fifth Lady Vol to become a three-time All-American, joining Abbott (2004, 2005, 2006, 2007), Chavanne (2010, 2011, 2012, 2013), Tonya Callahan (2006, 2007, 2008) and Lindsay Schutzler (2005, 2006, 2007). Gibson was also a Top 10 Finalist for USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year, a First Team All-SEC, SEC All-Defensive Team and SEC All-Tournament selection. Gibson's 19 home runs in 2013 set a new Tennessee single-season record. She finished her career ranked in the in the top 3 of many Tennessee offensive categories, including home runs (46, second), RBIs (216, third), slugging percentage (.644, tied for third) and on-base percentage (.484, tied for third).

Shipman earned All-American honors for the second straight year and enjoyed her finest season as a Lady Vol. The junior set new career highs with a .367 batting average, 11 home runs, 77 hits, 20 doubles, 52 runs, a .429 on-base percentage and a .619 slugging percentage. She also tied her previous career high with 63 RBIs. Her signature moment of the year was on softball's grandest stage. In Game 1 of the Championship Series against Oklahoma, Shipman hit a three-run homer off Keilani Ricketts in the top of the 11th to give the Lady Vols a 3-0 lead. Shipman was also a Capital One second-team Academic All-American, a First Team All-SEC pick and an SEC All-Defensive Team selection.

Junior pitcher Ellen Renfroe also shined her brightest at the 2013 Women's College World Series. Renfroe, who was a NFCA Division I All-Southeast Region second-team pick and a Capital One second-team Academic All-American, went 2-1 with a 1.97 ERA and 38 strikeouts over 32.0 innings in Oklahoma City. She tossed completegame wins against Florida and Washington a courageous 13-strikeout, 11-inning pitching duel in Game 1 of the Championship Series. On the year, Ellen Renfroe went 19-5 with a 1.85 ERA and 221 strikeouts over 200.2 frames.

Ivy Renfroe (22-5, 1,77 ERA, 148 strikeouts, 150.2 innings pitched) and Kat Dotson (.333 batting average, five homers, 11 doubles, five triples, 45 RBIs, 49 runs, 20 stolen bases) also had outstanding senior years to finish their distinguished Tennessee careers ranked among the very best in various statistical categories.

The Lady Vols' opened the year with a bang, scoring 18 runs on 22 hits in the season opener to take an 18-3 win over Southern Utah in the Red Desert Classic. The win also marked Tennessee's 800th program victory. The next day, Ellen Renfroe threw the second no-hitter of her career, fanning five batters over in a 10-0, five-inning win over Utah State.

On Feb. 21, the Lady Vols shut down Long Beach State, 7-0, in Karen Weekly's 800th career win as a head coach. Tennessee started the season 12-0 before a loss to Northwestern on Feb. 22.



Tennessee took two out of three against-then No. Alabama in the start of its SEC schedule from May 8-10. UT took a dramatic 4-3 win in the first game when Madison Shipman hit the game-winning RBI single in the bottom of the seventh. Tennessee has beaten a No. 1-ranked Alabama team in three straight years (2011, 2012, 2013). Ivy Renfroe went 2-0 on the week with a .68 ERA and eight strikeouts over 10.1 frames to sweep both the Louisville Slugger/NFCA National Player of the Week, and USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Week, becoming just the fifth Lady Vol to win both major weekly awards in the same week.

The Lady Vols enjoyed SEC series sweeps against then-No. 4 Texas A&M (March 22-24), Georgia (April 5-7), Auburn (April 12-14) and Ole Miss (April 19-21).

Chavanne was named the USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Week for the second time in her career on March 26 after she hit .750 with five RBIs, one homer, one double, six runs, three walks and three stolen bases as UT went 4-0 against then-No. 4 Texas A&M and Murray State.

UT's 9-2 road win over Georgia on April 6 marked Ralph Weekly's 1,100th win as a head coach. He was just the 14th head coach to achieve 1,100 wins. On April 7, Tennessee took a 6-1 win over the Bulldogs, marking its 600th win under the direction of the Weeklys.

On April 20, Gibson had a performance for the ages, going 4-for-5 with three home runs, one double, nine RBIs and four runs scored. She is the only Lady Vol to ever hit three home runs in one game and her nine RBIs tied a school record set by Dotson in 2011. Gibson was named the Louisville Slugger/NFCA National Player of the Week after hitting .818 (9-for-11) with five homers, three doubles, 18 RBIs, eight runs and three walks over the course of four wins against Appalachian State and Ole Miss. It was the first national weekly honor in Gibson's storied career.

Two weeks later, Gibson hit two home runs in a 12-8 (6) loss to Missouri, giving her 17 on the season at the time and breaking the previous Tennessee single-season record of 16 previously held by Tonya Callahan (2008) and Jessica Spigner (2011).

The Lady Vols had arguably their strongest run through the NCAA Tournament in team history going 8-0 through the NCAA Tournament and WCWS to reach the Championship Series. UT stormed through the Knoxville Regional with a 9-0 (5) win over Longwood, a marathon 11-inning 1-0 win over NC State and another 7-0 win over the Wolfpack. Tennessee took 3-2 and 5-3 wins over Alabama in the Knoxville Super Regional to punch its sixth ticket to the Women's College World Series.

Tennessee shined at the Women's College World Series, giving fans five exciting games and reaching the Championship Series. In Game 2 on May 30, UT took a 9-2 win over Florida thanks to some early scoring, a 3-for-4 effort by Dotson and a nine-strikeout gem by Ellen Renfroe. Tennessee edged Washington, 1-0, in Game 5 when Whitney Hammond's smart base running put the winning run on third and Tory Lewis knocked the gamewinning RBI single in the bottom of the seventh. Ellen Renfroe fired a 10-strikeout, two-hit shutout to shut down UW. In Game 11, Gibson hit a two-run homer and Lexi Overstreet drew a bases-loaded walk to back a strong pitching effort by Ivy Renfroe and Ellen Renfroe as the Lady Vols edged Texas, 2-1.

The first game of the Championship Series had everyone on the edge of their seats as the Lady Vols and Oklahoma clashed for a 12-inning pitcher's duel. At 12 innings, the game was the longest in Tennessee history. Madison Shipman's three-run homer to center field in the top of the 11th gave UT a 3-0 lead, but OU would score five runs in the next two innings to take the win. Ellen Renfroe was outstanding in the circle, striking out 13 batters in 11 innings to keep a potent Oklahoma lineup off the scoreboard for 10 innings.

Tennessee's amazing 2013 season came to a close in Game 2 of the Championship Series when Oklahoma took a 4-0 win to capture the national title. Gibson, Ellen Renfroe and Shipman were all named to the WCWS All-Tournament Team.

The Lady Vols graduate an outstanding senior class in Melissa Brown, Raven Chavanne, Kat Dotson, Lauren Gibson, Whitney Hammond and Ivy Renfroe, but will return a very strong core of players to make another run in 2014.





When the NCAA Selection Committee announced the 48-team field for the 1999 NCAA Softball Tournament, the Lady Vol softball squad heard the news it had been awaiting since the inception of its program in the fall of 1995. With a 44-25 overall record and a first-ever southeastern Conference Eastern Division title on its resume, Jim Beitia's club earned an at-large bid to one of the eight, six-team regional sites.

As a third seed, Tennessee traveled to Seattle, Wash., for a first round meeting with number four seed Cal-State Fullerton. Host Washington, ranked sixth nationally, drew the top seed in the double-elimination event on its home field. While the Orange & White dropped both of its contests in the Pacific Northwest, the results failed to lessen the achievement of participating in the nation's premier event after recording the program's most successful campaign to date.

UT managed a 3-2 overall record in the event, being eliminated in the championship contest by eventual Women's College World Series participant Virginia Tech and its All-American hurler Angela Tincher by a 4-2 count.

The Big Orange rode a combined one-hit shutout from Megan Rhodes and Ashton Ward to a 3-0 victory over Winthrop in both teams' opener, marking UT's 10 straight NCAA Regional victory dating back to 2004. Va. Tech utilized 14 strikeouts from Tincher and a surprise grand slam from No. 9 hitter Caroline Stolle to race past Tennessee 4-0 and drop the Lady Vols into the loser's bracket. Forced into action again later that day, UT blew out Louisville, 8-1, as freshman Jen Lapicki blasted a homer and knocked in four runs.

With two teams remaining with a chance at NCAA Super Regionals, UT had to beat Tech twice in the same day to advance. The Big Orange used the Erinn Webb power show to drop the Hokies 7-1 in the opener as the Hemet, Calif., native hammered two home runs in the triumph. Up 1-0 after three innings and with the momentum, UT was undone by a 50-minute rain delay. Following the break, Tech responded with a four-run top of the fourth to eventually prevail 4-2 and send UT home early.

The 2009 Tennessee Lady Vol softball team secured the program's sixth consecutive trip to NCAA Regionals as the nation's No. 13 seed for the second straight year. Hosting the regional round for the fifth consecutive season, UT advanced to the championship round of the event at Lee Stadium before dropping back-to-back match-ups to upstart Jacksonville State and ending its season at 40-18-1 overall.

A clutch RBI single in the bottom of the seventh inning from freshman third baseman Jessica Spigner backed 1.1 frames of scoreless relief by senior hurler Danielle Pieroni as Tennessee outlasted James Madison in its regional opener, 4-3. A 5-2 triumph over Nebraska on the strength of a clutch three-run, second-inning double by pinch hitter Ashton Ward sent the Big Orange through to face JSU for a place in NCAA Super Regionals.

Jacksonville State wasted little time in getting to UT for a pair of runs in the second frame and four more in the sixth on the way to a 6-1 victory to force a championship-deciding game. Despite jumping in front 1-0 during the opening inning on a sacrifice fly from junior catcher Tiffany Huff, Tennessee watched the Gamecocks rally for single tallies in the top of the fourth and fifth innings versus Pieroni to eventually prevail, 2-1, and advance through to the best-of-three Super Regionals.

Tennessee picked up the national No. 15 seeding and earned the right to host NCAA Regionals in Knoxville for the sixth straight season. UT swept its three match-ups to advance on to a best-of-three Super Regional for the first time since 2007.

In the opener versus Ball State, UT freshman pitcher lvy Renfroe tossed a four-hit shutout in her first NCAA Tournament action as the Lady Vols prevailed, 5-0. Rookie second baseman Lauren Gibson had the big blow at the plate with a tone-setting, two-run homer during the Lady Vols' three-run first inning.

The Big Orange set numerous NCAA program records, including those for most single-game runs, hits and RBIs, in an 11-2 rout of Virginia to advance to the Knoxville Regional title tilt for the sixth consecutive campaign. Freshman left fielder Raven Chavanne equaled a program NCAA mark with four hits as part of a 4-for-5, two-RBI effort, while junior center fielder Kelly Grieve went 3-for-5 with a double and two RBIs and sophomore third baseman Jessica Spigner was 2-for-5 with two RBIs.

Between Tennessee and its fourth all-time berth in the NCAA Super Regionals was Louisville, making its third trip to Knoxville for NCAA's after previous visits in 2006 & 2008. UL struck first on a HR by clean-up hitter Chelsea Bemis in the second inning. A two-out single by Grieve and an RBI double off the bat of Spigner tied the score at 1-1 in the fifth. With regulation play not enough, the match-up progressed to the ninth frame where a lead-off double by Gibson started a two-run UT outburst. Back in the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time since 2007, Tennessee was sent on the road to face No. 2 national seed Michigan. The powerful Wolverines entered the best-of three series having won 36 consecutive games at the Wilpon Softball Complex in Ann Arbor, Mich., dating back to the 2009 season.

Right from the start in the series opener, UT freshman pitcher Ivy Renfroe took control from the circle, carrying a no-hitter into the seventh inning in an eventual 5-0 upset of the Maize & Blue. Junior center fielder Kelly Grieve proved the heroine at the plate by contributing three, two-out RBIs during the shocking Big Orange victory.

With sophomore hurler Cat Hosfield keeping Michigan's bats in check over the first four innings of game two, Tennessee used the long ball to race to a commanding 4-0 advantage. When the annual NCAA bracket was announced, Tennessee, fresh off a thrilling SEC Tournament title run, was surprised to earn a lower-than-expected No. 14-seed in the field of 64. 



Tennessee earned its fifth trip to the Women's College World Series behind gritty performances from a variety of UT stars. In Oklahoma City, the Lady Vols battled hard, but came up short in two games. Tennessee was named the No. 7 seed of the 2013 NCAA Tournament and played host to Longwood, James Madison and NC State in the Knoxville Regional.






